

SECRETARY'S REPORT,

Presented at a General Meeting of the Members, on Wednesday the 5th January, 1887.



MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

In presenting to you the Seventh Annual Report, I have followed our usual custom of commencing with statistics, which will, I think, prove both satisfactory and instructive.

During the year 1886 our Active Membership has received an addition of 22, and this, after deducting resignations, &c., leaves us at the present time with 82 Active, and 125 Honorary Members. I would again draw your attention to the fact that though nominally a Bicycling Club, we have on our membership roll, the very best Road-riding Tricyclists in the Kingdom.

The Competition for the Attendance Prizes, (Officers debarred,) has been somewhat uninteresting, and has finally resulted in favor of Mr. G. P. Mills, the second prize falling to the lot of Mr. H. Pedder.

The average attendance at Club Runs has been 15, which, though good, is not what your Committee had hoped for; the slight falling off on last year's figures, is no doubt due to the presence of the Exhibition in Liverpool.

The Runs and Tours have all been pleasantly carried out, and the distance covered, amounts, in the aggregate, to about 2250 miles. The only casualty of importance, has been Mr. Hugh Fraser's fall on the Warrington Road, on the 1st of May, which unfortunately caused the fracture of his right arm. This accident was due to the carelessness of some unknown person, who had left a large block of stone lying in the roadway, after dark. Mr. Fraser's temporary incapacity to work, and also the calls of business in West Africa, compelled him to relinquish the Secretaryship of the Club, and I had the honor to be selected by your Committee, to fill the post rendered vacant by his resignation.

Long Distance Riding has again been freely indulged in, and the splendid performances of our members have secured for the "Anfield," a Road-riding reputation, which is second to none.

Several additional members have gained the 100 miles' stars, making in all 60, who have now won the badge.

The undernoted rides have been accomplished, and have, in accordance with the rules of the Club, been engraved upon the Long Distance Shield.

From the foregoing it will be seen that five additional members have earned their gold stars, viz:—A. W. Gamble, 212; T. B. Conway, 206; C. J. Large, 205; T. R. Marriott, 204 miles; all on bicycles; and W. Gracie, 182½ miles; tricycle.

In my last report (1885), I stated my belief that though our Long Distance Riders had done so well during that year, we should nevertheless find an improvement in 1886, and my belief has been more than verified by the astounding list of Records, now standing to the credit of the Club. As far as I can gather, there are 11 Road Records in existence, and of these, the "Anfield" holds seven, a proportion of which the members may well be proud.

Our Record-Breakers commenced operations at Midsummer, and being favored with almost perfect weather, Mr. G. P. Mills, in July, succeeded in riding an ordinary bicycle from the Land's End to John O'Groat's House, in 5 days 1 hour 45 minutes, thus beating the existing record by 1 day 6 hours 15 minutes. In this ride Mr. Mills was accompanied over the whole distance, by either

Messrs. A. W. Gamble or A. H. Fletcher, both of these riders doing much to assist the Record-Breaker.

On his return from the North, Mr. Mills proceeded to Biggleswade, and essaying a 24 hours' Bicycle Ride, was successful in covering 268½ miles within time, thus beating his own record of 259 miles. This rider then forsook the two wheeler, and mounting a tricycle early in August, and again securing fairly good weather, was successful in riding from the Land's End to John O'Groat's House in 5 days 10 hours, beating the Tricycle Record by 1 day 5½ hours, as well as eclipsing every previous Bicycle Record, except his own; on this ride also, Mr. Gamble, travelling by road and rail, checked and assisted Mr. Mills from start to finish, and it is not too much to say that the rider's success in both these "end to end" journeys, is largely due to the untiring zeal and activity of his fellow Clubman.

Again returning from the North to Biggleswade, Mr. Mills in quick succession placed to his credit the North Road Cycling Club 24 hours' Competition, in which in spite of a very bad day, and having no arrangements of any kind made for either feeding or checking, he covered 228 miles, the 100 miles Tandem Tricycle Record in 6 hours 46 minutes, with Mr. A. J. Wilson, also one of our members; the 50 miles Tandem Tricycle Record in 2 hours 46 minutes 3 seconds, with the same partner; the 50 miles Bicycle Record in 2 hours 47 minutes 35% seconds; and last, but by no means least, the 24 hours' Bicycle Road Record, in which he covered the astonishing distance of 295 miles on a Safety bicycle, thus beating by 27 miles his own previous best ride. All these records accomplished in the Biggleswade district still stand to the credit of Mr. Mills.

Mr. Alfred H. Fletcher at the end of June made a successful attempt on the 24 hours' Tricycle record, covering 250½ miles on the North Road within time, and beating the previous record by just 20 miles, this record still stands to his credit.

This rider also succeeded in beating the 50 miles Bicycle Record in 3 hours 9 minutes 56 seconds; and in conjunction with Mr. A. W. Gamble, beat the 100 miles Tandem Record, in

the course of a 24 hours' ride, the time for this performance being 7 hours 56 minutes. The two last records were afterwards taken over by Mr. G. P. Mills.

It will thus be seen that during 1886, our members have actually beaten 10 Records.

In addition to the above performances, the undernoted splendid rides have been accomplished by our members, and I believe I am right in saying that no cyclist outside the "Anfield" has covered such distances during the past twelve months.—

A. H. Fletcher (262½), G. B. Mercer (258), J. K. Conway (255) miles, all on bicycles; these riders as well as Mr. G. P. Mills have won the standard 250 miles medal.

Mr. E. Harrison also accomplished a grand ride of 232 miles on a bicycle. Mr. Norman Crooke had covered 220 miles with several hours to spare, when a severe fall compelled him to give up. I look for both these riders, as well as a number of other members, to beat 250 miles during 1887.

The Annual 24 hours' Road-Ride was held over a new course, through Crewe, Newport, and Derby, to Kegworth, in Leicestershire. The usual five guinea prizes were offered for Bicyclists and Tricyclists, subject to the customary limitations as to distance. The day proved very unfavorable, the roads being heavy, and a strong wind preventing fast travelling, none of the leaders rode out their full time, the placing and the prizes being:—bicycle, G. P. Mills 228 miles, (gold-centre medal,) J. K. Conway and N. Crooke 201 miles, (silver medals;) tricycle, A. H. Fletcher 177 miles, (silver medal.)

The attendance at the Easter Tour, was as usual very satisfactory, 23 members putting in an appearance at Bettws-y-Coed, whilst 26 took part in the Road-Ride during Whit week.

The Club held its Annual Race Meeting on the new Grounds, and excellent entries were obtained, these however, owing to the counter attraction of the Exhibition, failed to draw a gate, and we are fortunate in having escaped without a loss.

The N.C.U. Local Centre decided to hold three local Championships, viz. :- one and five miles Bicycle, and one mile

Tricycle. Both of the Bicycle Championships were won by our members, Mr. C. E. Stoker taking the one mile, and Mr. D. J. Bell the five miles.

The Long Distance Competition for the year, has been won by Mr. G. P. Mills, with 182 points, Mr. A. H. Fletcher being second with 80, Mr. A. W. Gamble 3rd with 43, and Mr. W. McG. Gracie 4th with 23 points.

The Club Socials have all been remarkably successful, and the new Boxing Classes and Home-Trainer Competitions at the Club House, every Wednesday evening, have proved to be very

attractive to the members.

No. 5.—A Silver Star for 100 miles on any machine, in the natural day. Previous winners barred.

No. 6.—A Gold Medal to the member covering the longest distance in 24 consecutive hours, upon Roads in the Home District, during 1887. At least 20 Club Runs must have been carried out by the winner. Presented by Mr. Arthur Russell.

No. 7.—Special Gold Medals for beating existing road records.

No. 8.—Medals for attendance at runs, First, presented by

Mr. D. J. Bell; Second, presented by Mr. J. H. Cook.
