HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the
Members on Thursday, the 6th January, 1910.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

In again presenting the Annual Report of the doings of your Club, I will first give the usual statistics.

We started the year with an active membership of 100, and we finish with 100, the resignations numbering six, and the additions to membership six. Fifty-two fixtures have been arranged, and of these only two members have attended all. The largest muster (65) was at Whitsuntide, and the smallest (13) at Malpas on September 4th. The average attendance is 33.10, which is record. The individual figures are:—

The first week-end of the season, on 6th March, was carried out under very adverse climatic conditions, a heavy fall of snow on the Friday night prevented all but six members reaching Denbigh—the venue.

Easter again saw us gathered at the shrine of former years, Bettws-y-Coed. Runs were taken to Llandudno, Criccieth and Carnarvon, and helped by the glorious weather were very well supported. 35 members turned out for this fixture.

The All-Night, which was fixed for Dumfries, had to be abandoned owing to a record attempt on the same date.

The August Holiday Tour which was arranged in Ireland, with Glenmalur as headquarters, attracted 17 members, and they seem to have had a splendid time in every respect.

For a number of years we have not had a representative in the Bath Road 100, but as three of our men expressed their

desire to ride, fourteen members undertook the journey, thus unfortunately missing the Irish Tour.

The last week-end of the season, to Llangollen, on 30th October, though favoured with the best of weather, only attracted 20 members, most of them being the old hands.

Our Racing Programme has been carried out with moderate success.

The first "50" on 1st May was spoilt by a very strong and extremely cold wind. Out of 14 starters ten finished; first and fastest going to R. A. Fulton (on 10mins.) who did a splendid ride for the day, his time being 2hrs. 33mins. 56secs.; second, E. Buckley (5mins.) 2hrs. 35mins. 50 secs.; third, A. P. James, tricycle (25mins.), 2hrs. 56mins. 21secs.; J. R. Wells (10mins.) 2hrs. 41mins. 34secs.; G. E. Carpenter (20mins.) 2hrs. 52mins. 11secs.; F. D. McCann (10mins.) 2hrs. 45mins. 19secs.; J. C. Band (scratch) 2hrs. 35mins. 24secs.; C. H. Turnor (20mins) 2hrs. 57mins. 11secs.; A. Crowcroft (24mins.) 3hrs. 1min. 25secs.; F. Band (10mins.) 2hrs. 56mins. 58secs.; E. J. Cody, F. H. Koenen, F. C. Lowcock and H. Poole also started, but did not complete the course.

The second "50" on May 15th attracted 19 starters out of whom 18 finished, eight of these being inside 2hrs. 40mins. Fastest time went to F. C. Lowcock, whose time of 2hrs. 30mins. 13secs. makes very good reading when we consider that the thermometer was in the neighbourhood of freezing. N. M. Higham (18mins.) won the handicap with 2hrs. 43mins. 52secs.; second, H. Dakin (27mins.) 2hrs. 53mins. 31secs.; third, F. D. McCann (12 mins.) 2hrs. 38mins. 33secs.; J. R. Wells (9mins.) 2hrs. 36mins. 6secs.; F. Band (10mins.) 2hrs. 39mins. 25secs.; E. Buckley (2½mins.) 2hrs. 32mins. 40secs.; F. C. Lowcock (scratch) 2hrs. 30mins. 13secs.; C. H. Turnor (23mins.) 2hrs. 53mins. 23secs.; F. H. Koenen (22mins.) 2hrs. 53mins. 15secs.; E. A. Bentley (12mins.) 2hrs. 44mins. 28secs.; G. E. Carpenter (21mins.) 2hrs. 53mins. 35secs.; E. J. Cody (scratch) 2hrs. 32mins. 37secs.; R. A. Fulton (1min.) 2hrs. 33mins. 48 secs.; A. P. James, tricycle, (21mins.) 2hrs. 54mins. 34secs.; M. O. Sarson (18mins.) 2hrs. 53mins. 42secs.; A. Crowcroft (27mins.) 3hrs. 2mins. 48secs.; W. M. Bailey

(scratch) 2hrs. 39mins. 54secs.; W. L. George (18mins.) 3hrs. 6mins. 43secs. J. J. Rogers also started, but did not finish.

The weather again favoured our Invitation "100" on Whit Monday, and with the wind in a southerly direction, three men got inside F. Wingrave's record for the course. R. Etherington, of the Bath Road Club, easily obtained fastest time, his figures being 5hrs. 13mins. 5secs.; F. H. Grubb (Vegetarian) being second fastest with 5hrs. 16mins. 40secs.; and L. C. Palmer (North London) third with 5hrs. 16mins. 49secs.; J. A. Grimshaw (22mins.), of the Cheadle Harrier, a comparatively new man, somewhat easily won the Handicap with the fine time of 5hrs. 20mins. 46secs.; A. H. Thayer, Salford Wheelers (on 28mins.), being second with 5hrs. 30mins. 28secs.; and J. R. Wells (25 mins.) of "ours," a complete novice at the distance, secured third prize with the good time of 5hrs. 28mins. 36secs. Out of the 53 other starters 29 finished, including six of our own men, who finished in the following order:—9th, F. D. McCann (28mins.) 5hrs. 37mins. 35secs.; 20th, W. M. Bailey (10mins.) 5hrs. 30mins. 2secs.; 25th, E. Buckley (15mins.) 5hrs. 38mins. 21secs.; 28th, J. J. Rogers (16mins.) 5hrs. 42mins. 19secs.; 30th, M. O. Sarson (40mins.) 6hrs. 9mins. 9secs.; and 35th, G. E. Carpenter (35mins.) 6hrs. 19mins. 16secs. The names of our men who did not complete the course were J. C. Band, E. J. Cody, R. A. Fulton and W. H. Kettle.

Our most successful event of the year was, without doubt, the "24," which was run on July 2nd and 3rd over the usual course with one or two slight alterations. The weather was delightful until the last three hours, when heavy rain drenched the riders and spoiled the roads. E. Buckley was first with the magnificent total of 363½ miles, which beats Northern (his own) record by no less than 16½ miles. R. A. Fulton also did a splendid ride, his distance being 342 miles, this giving him second prize and also the "F. Gee" Cup, which was offered to the winner of a Handicap framed for this event; third prize was won by F. D. McCann (a first year man), with the fine distance of 329½ miles. C. H. Turnor ran McCann very close, his total being 328 miles. J. R. Wells came next with 318 miles and G. Poole followed with 311½

miles. The two tricyclists, A. P. James and W. H. Kettle, finished with 303½ and 274 miles respectively. G. E. Carpenter also started, but being delayed with repeated punctures and finding that he could not reach his last year's figures, gave up at Whitechurch, the first time. The five riders, Fulton, McCann, Turnor, Wells and Poole, who rode over 300 miles in the day for the first time, bring the total number of Anfielders who have accomplished this feat to 40, which must be record for any club in the world.

We had excellent weather for the 3rd "50" on 21st August, which makes it all the more unaccountable for the comparative failure of the short mark men. Buckley, one of our most consistent riders, winning fastest time medal with 2hrs. 32mins. 23secs. The race was won by Bentley, who improved over five minutes on his previous best, and made a sad mess of the handicap. The following was the order of the finishers: First, E. A. Bentley (14mins.) 2hrs. 35mins. 44secs.; second, C. H. Turnor (21mins.) 2hrs. 45mins. 37secs.; third, W. L. George (20mins.) 2hrs. 46mins. 59 secs.; fourth, J. J. Rogers (5mins.) 2hrs. 35mins. 22secs.; fifth, E. Buckley (5mins.) 2hrs. 32mins. 23secs.; sixth, H. R. Band (16mins.) 2hrs. 48mins. 1sec.; seventh, F. C. Lowcock (2mins.) 2hrs. 34mins. 27secs.; eighth, R. T. Ridd (23mins.) 2hrs. 57mins. 45secs.; ninth, J. C. Band (scratch) 2hrs. 35mins. 14secs; F. H. Koenen and F. D. McCann also started.

The fourth and last "50" was held on the 18th September and was favoured with ideal weather. G. Poole (15mins.) created a great surprise with a splendid ride of 2hrs. 34mins. 40secs., which not only gave him fastest time, but easily placed him first in the Handicap. H. R. Band (16mins.) secured second place with 2hrs. 42mins. 18secs., and F. D. McCann (6mins.) third, with 2hrs. 36mins. 1sec.; this ride also gave McCann the special prize for fastest novice of the year. J. J. Rogers (5mins.) was fourth with 2hrs. 39mins. 13secs., and J. C. Band (scratch) fifth with 2hrs. 37mins. 21secs; R. A. Fulton also started, but did not finish.

Attempts at records have been numerous, but, unfortunately, we hold one record less, the Liverpool-London Tandem, than at the end of 1908.

The first attempt was at the Northern 50 Miles Tricycle by A. P. James on 5th June, but after riding eight miles the attempt was abandoned owing to rain. On the following Saturday the same rider managed to secure the record with 2hrs. 49mins. 9secs.

On the 19th June, E. Buckley started from Edinburgh on an attempt on the Edinburgh-Liverpool Bicycle Record. Though hampered by a head wind and wet roads, Buckley nevertheless managed to beat record by 19 minutes, his time being 13hrs. 34mins. Buckley had a try to reduce his own record on 30th August, but having to face half a gale of wind for nearly the whole distance, arrived at the G.P.O. just five minutes outside. The record has been unfortunately lost to the club later on in the year, W. Jones, the ex-holder, beating Buckley's figures.

J. C. Band, on July 10th, 17th and 24th, made unsuccessful attempts on the Northern 50 Miles Bicycle Record, but, being entirely out of luck with the weather, failed to accomplish his task; nevertheless, in his attempt on the 17th July, Band got within $3\frac{1}{2}$ minutes of record, his time being 2hrs. 24mins. 40secs., this being the fastest unpaced "50" ever done by an Anfielder, your Committee awarded the rider a special Bronze Medal for his performance.

On August 27th and 28th, A. P. James, favoured with the best of weather, broke the 24 Hours Northern Tricycle Record, his distance being 314 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

E. Buckley and C. H. Turnor on September 24th/25th made an unsuccessful attempt at the 24 hours Tandem Bicycle Records, but after a plucky struggle against the heavy rain, had to abandon the attempt owing to all their tyres giving out.

Ⓔ Buckley heads the prize list and well deserves the honour, his "24" and two Edinburgh-Liverpool rides were three of the best and pluckiest performances ever done by an Anfielder.

F. D. McCann comes next; he has not missed a race this season and, though a first year man, has ridden so well that he has secured three third prizes and the "50" novice and

the Del Strother prizes. We hope to see McCann close to the top of the prize list for many years to come.

R. A. Fulton, who takes third place on the roll of honour, has shown us during the past season what we expected from him in previous years.

G. Poole has ridden remarkably well and is a man whom we expect to see adjacent to the scratch mark before long.

J. R. Wells, another novice, if he only has the pluck to stick at the sport, will do rides equal, if not better, than any done by Moss and Wingrave during the past season.

E. A. Bentley and C. H. Turnor have both improved wonderfully.

W. H. Kettle gave us a glimpse of his true form in the "24" as he did a very good ride indeed, when one considers that he was buying his experience of tricycle riding.

W. M. Bailey, J. C. Band, F. C. Lowcock and J. J. Rogers in the Club competitions have either been out of luck or have not ridden in their true form. I am sure it is the wish of the whole Club that these riders will return to their past form in 1910.

H. R. Band, W. L. George and M. O. Sarson will undoubtedly, with more experience at the game, do much better in the future.

In conclusion, I should like to thank all those members who have assisted the Club by checking, etc., in our races, and also those who have so materially helped me in my Secretarial work.

H. W. Keizer moved, and A. M. Higham seconded, and it was **RESOLVED**—

“That the Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting be taken as read, and that they be confirmed.”

L. Oppenheimer moved, and A. M. Higham seconded, and it was **RESOLVED**—

“That the report of the Hon. Secretary be adopted.”

A. M. Higham moved and E. Buckley seconded and it was unanimously RESOLVED—

“That a vote of confidence be given to the Handicapping Committee for the work they had done.”

C. H. Turnor moved, and C. J. Conway seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That the accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1909, be adopted.”

W. M. Owen moved, and H. Poole seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That the Annual Subscription for Active Members during the year 1910 shall be One Guinea, with an Entrance Fee of Five Shillings, and the Annual Subscription for Honorary Members a minimum of Ten Shillings, and that the Prize-Fund be continued.”

L. Oppenheimer proposed and C. H. Turnor seconded—

“That the issue of the Monthly Circular be discontinued, and that official announcements and Club runs be notified by Monthly Card as formerly.”

On being put to the Meeting the motion was lost.

The Secretary, in the absence of P. C. Beardwood, proposed and R. E. Prichard seconded, to alter Rule 22 to read as follows:—

“Any Active Member who has paid his Annual Subscription for 15 years or more can apply for Life Membership upon permanently ceasing to reside within a 25 mile radius of Liverpool and/or Manchester, the subscription for same being £10 10s. paid to the funds of the Club in advance; should such Member permanently reside outside a radius of 100 miles of Liverpool or Manchester, the subscription to be £5 5s. payable in advance.”

“Any Member availing himself of Life Membership and subsequently coming back to reside permanently in the Liverpool or Manchester area, will cease to be a Life Member, and any monies paid will be treated as Annual Subscription in advance, dating from the year application was made for such

Life Membership, this not to apply to Life Members, of five years or more standing."

On being put to the Meeting the motion was lost.

F. Gee and G. J. Theakstone having been appointed Scrutineers, G. B. Mercer, proposed by H. Poole and seconded by E. Edwards, was re-elected President.

E. Edwards, proposed by H. Poole and seconded by N. M. Higham, and A. M. Higham, proposed by A. P. James and seconded by H. Poole, were elected Vice-Presidents.

J. R. Wells, proposed by E. Edwards and seconded by W. R. Toft, was elected Captain.

E. Buckley, proposed by H. Roskell and seconded by C. H. Turnor, and F. D. McCann, proposed by W. P. Cook and seconded by G. Poole, were elected Sub-Captains.

W. M. Owen, proposed by W. P. Cook and seconded by C. J. Conway, was re-elected Hon. Treasurer.

A. P. James, proposed by H. Poole and seconded by C. Keizer, was re-elected Hon. Secretary.

It was resolved by ballot that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee:—H. R. Band, C. Blackburn, S. J. Buck, H. W. Keizer, R. E. Prichard, G. Poole, H. Poole, and E. G. Worth.

W. P. Cook proposed, and R. A. Fulton seconded, and it was carried, that D. R. Fell and J. Lowenthal be re-elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1910.

J. R. Wells proposed, and S. J. Buck seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

"That the Club's Racing Programme consist of three or four 50 miles Unpaced Handicaps at the discretion of the Committee, 100 miles Invitation Unpaced Handicap, and the 24 Hours' Unpaced Road Ride, and that Tandems be allowed to compete in the last '50.'"

C. H. Turnor proposed, and N. M. Higham seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That an Entrance Fee of 10/6 be charged all entrants for the 24 Hours' Road Ride to cover feeding expenses.”

E. G. Worth proposed, and H. Poole seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That a special Prize, value Three Guineas, in lieu of the usual Gold Medal be awarded to any first claim member who succeeds in beating any of the Unpaced Place to Place Records recognised by the Road Records Association, and not held by a member or members of the Anfield Bicycle Club. Tandem riders to divide the Prize, as per Rule S.”

R. A. Fulton proposed, and S. J. Buck seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That a special Prize be awarded to the member doing fastest novice time during the year in any of the 50 mile handicaps. No rider shall be eligible for this prize who has won any prize or standard medal in any cycle race prior to 1st January, 1910.”

C. J. Conway proposed, and G. J. Theakstone seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed.”

R. A. Fulton proposed, and C. Blackburn seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“To recommend, to the Committee, York as the destination of the June All-night Ride.”

N. M. Higham proposed, and S. J. Buck seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“That the August Bank Holiday Tour be in Ireland.”

W. P. Cook reported that F. Del Strother offered another special prize, and it was unanimously decided that it be awarded to the first placed Anfielder in the 100 Miles Invitation Handicap, prize winners barred.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to F. Del Strother for his continued generosity.

The meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers and Hon. Secretary.

= RULES. =



- 1.—This Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."
- 2.—This Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 20.
- 3.—No Active Member of this Club shall be permitted to join or retain active membership in any other Local Cycling Club. This Rule shall not apply to Clubs in which existing Anfielders have held membership prior to 30th June, 1891.

Officers.

- 4.—The Officers of this Club shall consist of President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries and Treasurer, all being Active Members.

Committee.

- 5.—The Committee shall consist of sixteen Members including the Officers.

Auditors.

- 6.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine, and report upon, the Accounts and Balance Sheet

Meetings.

- 7.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's report and Treasurer's Balance-Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.

- 8.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

- 9.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Members of the Club, and they shall call

such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it.

10.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.

11.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters should send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.

12.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted URGENT by two-thirds of the Members present.

13.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made "in propria persona" by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.

14.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.

15.—No resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.

16.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

17.—ALL Active Members residing at a distance of not less than fifteen miles from Liverpool may exercise the right of Proxy Voting upon any subject appearing on the Agenda of any General Meeting, or which the Chairman may rule to be coincident thereto.

18.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.

19.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

Active Membership.

20.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Active Members of the Club for at least six months), and forward the same to the Secretary. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly Circular issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

21.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

Life Membership.

22.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member of 15 years standing; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Active Membership.

Honorary Membership.

23.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Active Members, and shall, unless objected to, be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 20. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years standing who shall be leaving the

country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Active Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

24.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor compete for any of its long-distance prizes, or in any of its closed events.

25.—An Honorary Member may become an Active Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

Subscriptions, &c.

26.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-. no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Active Members shall be one Guinea, payable within one month from date of election, with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

Resignations, &c.

27.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.

28.—Any Active Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

Finance.

29.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club, the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

30.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December in each year.

Club Colours.

31.—That the Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours; Record Breaker's Badges are distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badge to be the property of the Club and to be returned, if called for, upon the expiration of membership to the Hon. Sec., who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

Committee.

32.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.

33.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.

34.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal, in writing, be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

Tandem riders to divide the Prize as per Rule 8.

No. 9.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same ride. No 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No Standard Medals can be claimed for any distance in Place to Place Record rides. Gold Medal, from Club Die, shall only be awarded for Records, Fastest Times, First Prizes, Standards in 12, and 24 hours, from Standard E and upwards, and in 100 miles for Standard D and upwards.

No. 10.—Members winning Medals may substitute Prizes of equal value, subject to the approval of the Committee as to the form these may take.
