HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members on Friday, January 5th, 1912,

· MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

In presenting my fourth and final report of the doings of our club I will give first the usual figures.

We started the year with an active membership of 102, and we finished with the same number (two resignations and two new members).

Fifty-four fixtures have been arranged, and two members have attended all-Messrs. Cook and Turnor.

The largest muster was 50, at the "100," and the smallest was eight, on the August Holiday Tour to Ireland. The average attendance was 25.2, which is very poor.

Easter was, as usual, spent at Bettws, and the outing was made even more pleasant than usual, as the members took the opportunity of making a small presentation to Edwards, Toft and Worth, who, early in the year, had each attended 1,000 runs with the Club.

The August Tour was arranged, for the third time in succession to Ireland. Only eight members supported this fixture.

Our Racing Programme has been carried out with only moderate success.

The first "50" was run over a Cheshire Course in bad weather. H. R. Band proved the winner, with 2hrs. 44mins. 4secs.; W. Jones being second and fastest with 2hrs. 43mins. 27secs.; and Grimshaw third with 2hrs. 47mins. 54secs. Eight riders started in this event, and seven finished. The second "50" (in Shropshire) on 20th May saw much faster time done, Grimshaw doing 2hrs. 25mins. 56secs., which gave him first place in the Handicap and fastest time. W. L. George was second with 2hrs. 42mins. 15secs., and E. Webb third with 2hrs. 40mins. 4secs. Nine men started and finished in this race, which was held in perfect weather.

The "100" was again favoured with magnificent weather, and, as of yore, was a great success. Record for the course was well beaten by C. Moss (M.C. and A.C.), who did the splendid time of 5hrs. 11mins. 52secs., which, of course, gave him fastest time. The Handicap was won by J. W. Kirk (Yorkshire R.C.), who did 5hrs. 26mins. 35secs., W. R. Lempriere (N.R.C.C.) being second with 5hrs. 22mins. 15secs., and H. H. Gayler (Polytechnic C.C.) third with 5hrs. 21mins. 4secs. Grimshaw "of Ours" did a very fine ride of 5hrs. 16mins. 25secs., as did Buckley with 5hrs. 40mins. 39secs., which secured for him the Del Strother Prize.

Our best race of the season was, as usual, the "24," held on 14th/15th July, Buckley turing out the winner with the great figures of 375 miles. Grimshaw, whose first "24" it was, being second with 364 miles, and G. E. T. Poole third with 339 miles.

The August "50" had to be abandoned owing to the Railway Strikes which were, at that time, in full force.

The September "50" cannot be said to have been a real success, as it only attracted five starters. Nevertheless McCann put in a fine ride of 2hrs. 37mins. 16secs., which gave him the Handicap. Grimshaw was fastest and secured third place with 2hrs. 34mins. 30secs., H. R. Band being second with 2hrs. 42mins. 16secs.

Only one Record has been broken this season, Turnor beating Buckley's 24 hours Northern Bicycle figures by three miles, his distance being 350⁴/₃ miles.

H. W. Keizer moved, and C. H. Turnor seconded, and it was nesonven-

"That the Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting be taken as read, and that they be confirmed."

G. J. Theakstone moved, and G. Poole seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the report of the Hon. Secretary be adopted."

A vote of thanks to A. P. James for his services as Secretary was proposed from the Chair and carried with acclamation. C. H. Turnor moved, and C. J. Conway seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1911, be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be given to W. M. Owen for the services he has rendered to the club as Treasurer."

W. M. Owen moved, and A. P. James seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Annual Subscription for Active Members during the year 1912 shall be One Guinea, with an Entrance Fee of Five Shillings, and the annual Subscription for Honorary Members a minimum of Ten Shillings, and that the Prize Fund be continued."

W. M. Owen moved, and R. L. L. Knipe seconded, and it was carried unanimously-

"That Mr. S. Irving's name be placed on the Honorary List, during his residence abroad, for services rendered to the club."

J. H. Sunter and C. Keizer having been appointed Scrutineers, A. M. Higham, proposed by G. Theakstone, and seconded by E. A. Bentley, was re-elected President.

E. Edwards, proposed by J. R. Wells and seconded by C. J. Conway, and G. B. Mercer, proposed from the Chair, were elected Vice-Presidents.

F. D. McCann, proposed by G. Poole and seconded by E. Buckley, was elected Captain.

S. J. Buck, proposed by E. Edwards and seconded by G. Poole, and C. H. Turnor, proposed by E. Edwards and seconded by H. W. Keizer, were elected Sub-Captains.

W. M. Owen, proposed by the Chair and carried with acclamation, was re-elected Hon. Treasurer.

W. P. Cook, proposed by W. R. Toft and seconded by F. D. McCann and supported by R. L. L. Knipe, was elected Hon. Secretary.

In W. P. Cook's absence, C. H. Turnor was appointed acting Hon. Sec. for the purpose of recording the minutes of the meeting. It was resolved by ballot that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee:—E. Buckley, N. M. Higham, G. E. T. Poole, H. Poole, T. Royden, G. Stevenson, W. R. Toft, and E. G. Worth.

G. Theakstone proposed, and E. Edwards seconded, and it was carried, that D. R. Fell and J. Lowenthal be re-elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1912.

F. D. McCann proposed, and E. Edwards seconded, and it was resolved-

"That the Club's Racing Programme consist of two or three 50 miles Unpaced Handicaps, at the discretion of the Committee, 100 miles Invitation Unpaced Handicap, a 24 Hours Unpaced Road Ride and a 12 Hours Unpaced Road Ride, and that it be left to the Committee to decide whether the latter should be a Handicap Ride or not."

H. W. Keizer proposed, and R. T. Rudd seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That all entrants for the 24 Hours Road Ride and the 12 Hours Road Ride be charged 10/6 and 5/- respectively, to cover feeding expenses."

J. R. Wells offered a prize value $\pm 5.5/$ - to be awarded to the first Anfielder who finishes in the Handicap of the Bath Road 100. The rule with reference to attendance to be inoperative in this case.

W. P. Cook proposed, and H. W. Keizer seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That a Special Prize, value Three Guineas, in lieu of the usual Gold Medal be awarded to any first claim member who succeeds in beating any of the Unpaced Place to Place Records recognised by the Road Records Association, and not held by a member or members of the Anfield Bicycle Club. Tandem Riders to divide the Prize, as per Rule 8."

C. J. Conway proposed, and G. J. Theakstone seconded, and it was resolved-

"That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed."

A. P. James proposed, and J. R. Wells seconded, and it was resolved-

"That the All-Night Ride be to Leamington, in June."

A proposition that the August Tour be in the neighbourhood of the Bath Road 100 was lost, and W. R. Toft proposed, and D. C. Rowatt seconded, and it was carried that the tour be somewhere nearer Liverpool and that it be left to the discretion of the Committee.

W. P. Cook reported that F. Del Strother offered another special prize, and it was unanimously decided that it be awarded to the first claim Anfielder in the 100 Miles Invitation Handicap, who, in the opinion of the Committee, does the most meritorious performance.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to F. Del Strother for his continued generosity, a similar vote of thanks being accorded to J. R. Wells for his offer of a prize.

W. P. Cook, who was not present at the time he was elected to the position of Secretary, refused the Office.

C. H. Turnor, proposed by R. L. L. Knipe and seconded by A. P. James, was elected Secretary.

The meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers and Hon. Secretary.

Note. At the January Committee Meeting, C. H. Turnor and F. D. McCann tendered their resignations of the offices of Hon. Secretary and Captain, respectively. W. R. Toft was elected Captain, while F. D. McCann took over the duties of Hon. Secretary. W. P. Cook was unanimously elected to a seat on the Committee.

RULES.

1.-This Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."

2.—This Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

Officers.

3.—The Officers of this Club shall consist of President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Active Members.

Committee.

4.—The Committee shall consist of sixteen Members including the Officers.

Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine, and report upon, the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

Meetings.

6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance-Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.

7. A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it. 9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.

10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters should send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.

11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted URGENT by two-thirds of the Members present.

12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made "in propria persona" by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.

13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.

14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.

15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

(16,—All Active Members residing at a distance of not less than fifteen miles from Liverpool may exercise the right of Proxy Voting upon any subject appearing on the Agenda of any General Meeting, or which the Chairman may rule to be coincident thereto. All proxy votes must be lodged with the Hon. Secretary before the meeting and must state specifically for what subject or subjects they are to be used.

17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary. 18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

Active Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Active Members of the Club for at least six months), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly Circular issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member of 15 years' standing; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Active Membership.

Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Active Members, and shall, unless objected to, be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Active Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the long-distance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become an Active Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

Subscriptions, &c.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Active Members shall be One Guinea, payable within one month from date of election, with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

Resignations, &c.

26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office. 27.—Any Active Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

Finance.

28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club, the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December in each year.

Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours; Record Breakers' Badges are distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badge to be the property of the Club and to be returned, if called for, upon the expiration of Membership to the Hon. Sec., who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

Committee.

31.-All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.

32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.

33. The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

The Unpaced Standards do not constitute a separate class as compared with Paced Standards.

No. 6.—A Gold Medal, value Two Guineas, will be awarded to any *first-claim* Member who succeeds in beating any of the Road Records, or Northern Road Records for the time being, the ride to be proved to the satisfaction of the Road Records Association or Northern Road Records Association, as the case may be.

A Special Prize value Three Guineas in lieu of the usual Gold Medal will be awarded to any *first-claim* Member who succeeds in beating any of the Unpaced Place to Place Records recognised by the Road Records Association, and not held by a Member, or Members, of the Anfield Bicycle Club. Tandem riders to divide the Prize as per Rule 8.

A Member who succeeds in beating a Record more than once shall be entitled to a Medal for the highest performance ONLY at each distance during the year. This Rule does not apply to the Special Place to Place Record Prizes.

No. 9.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same ride. No 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No. 10.—Members winning Medals may substitute Prizes of equal value, subject to the approval of the Committee as to the form these may take.

No. 11.—Claims for Medals, accompanied by proofs, must be sent in to the Hon. Secretary within 7 days after the performance of each ride.

No. 12.—No distance ridden in any of the Competitions will be recognised if it be done either wholly or partially on a Sunday, and no Member shall be permitted to ride in any of the Club races or time trials who has taken part in any race or time trial held on Sundays, subsequent to 1910.

No. 13.—NO PIECE OF ROAD MAY, UPON ANY PRETEXT, BE COVERED MORE THAN TWICE, or if covered, shall not be counted in the total distance claimed.

No. 14. Motor pacing or following is entirely barred. In attempts for unpaced Standard Medals, followers are not allowed to approach the rider within 300 yards.

No. 15.—All Prizes and Medals will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who shall have full power to decide any question which may arise as to the interpretation or application of the rules.

Races.

Members are requested to consider the information contained herein as "Private and Confidential." It is intended to hold during the season, not exceeding three Unpaced Fifty Miles Road Handicaps for Single Machines, over courses to be selected by the Committee. Four Prizes in each event will be offered, viz.:—First, Second, Third and Gold Medal for the fastest time.

Time Medals will be awarded as under to first-claim Members, Prize Winners barred :---

In connection with this event. Three Silver and Three Bronze Medals will be awarded to the Teams doing the best and second best aggregate times.

The 12 Hours Unpaced Handicap Road Ride for Single and Tandem Machines will be held over a course to be selected by the Committee, when three prizes will be offered. An Entrance Fee of 5/- will be charged each entrant to assist in covering feeding and other expenses.

The 24 Hours Unpaced Scratch Road Ride for Single Machines will be held over a course to be selected by the Committee, when three Prizes will be offered. An Entrance Fee of 10/6 will be charged each entrant to assist in covering feeding and other expenses.

The above three events will also give *first-claim* Members opportunities of competing for the Unpaced Standards as per lists.

In all cases the Committee reserve the right to decline

any entry and to cancel any fixture.

Prizes will be withheld if, in the opinion of the Committee, the performances done are not sufficiently meritorious.

Special Prizes.
