# HON. GEN. SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members, 12th January, 1929.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I again have much pleasure in presenting my Report of the Club's touring and social activities for the year 1928.

The Membership now numbers 196, an increase of 4 since last year. This figure is composed of 153 Full, 6 Junior Full and 37 Honorary Members. 10 New Members have been elected during the year, viz., 8 Full, 1 Junior Full and 1 Honorary.

Four resignations have been accepted and two names struck off.

I am pleased to report a slight improvement in the attendances at the Fixtures during the year, but there is still, in my opinion, room for a greater support in this direction, and I would appeal to all members to endeavour to make the coming Jubilee Year a record one in this respect.

There have been 53 Fixtures during the year, with an average attendance of 40.6, an increase of 2 over 1927. Quarterly average attendances were: January to March, 39.5; April to June, 46.8 July to September, 38.9; and October to December, 35.4.

As usual the highest attendance was at the Invitation "100," when 95 members were out.

The lowest attendance was 23 at Tarporley, on the 17th November; it is true on this day there was a pretty stiff Nor-West wind, but I am certain that was not the real reason for the small attendance.

Two members, Messrs. W. P. Cook and J. Long, have attended all the runs next comes Mr. W. H. Kettle with 52.

Mr. T. Royden again takes the first attendance prize with a score of 51, Mr. E. J. Cody and Mr. H. Green share the second attendance prize with 50 runs each to their credit.

Before I read the individual attendances, I would like to place on record the fact that during the year, Mr. J. Band completed his 1,000 runs, and I would like, on behalf of the Club, to offer him our heartiest congratulations.

I now come to the Club Tours, they have already been reported very fully in the *Circular*, therefore, I will be as brief as possible.

Easter again found the Club at Bettws-y-Coed, with headquarters at the Glan Aber. For some, the Tour actually commenced on the Thursday, but the bulk of the tourists arrived in time for dinner, on Friday. In all, 29 members and 6 friends joined the Tour. Good weather, and practically the entire absence of motor traffic, made the Tour very enjoyable.

The daily runs were well supported. At Llanfairtalhaiarn, on Friday, there were 28, including those who were out for the day.

Saturday, at Caernarvon, there were 20, and on Sunday, at Portmadoc, 28.

Monday's homeward run again found the majority lunching

at Denbigh, and with several members out for the day, 25 foregathered at The Bull.

For the alternative Easter Tour, the Yorkshire Dales was chosen. It was found necessary on account of accommodation to fix headquarters at Catterick Bridge. 14 members joined in the Tour and had a very enjoyable time, the weather was good, but at times motor traffic was inclined to be a nuisance.

Most of the tourists arrived at Catterick on Friday evening via Bolton Bridge.

Saturday, the ride was by way of Aysgarth, over the Buttertubs, returning via Richmond.

Sunday-Fountains Abbey and Ripon for tea.

Monday's homeward run was through Kettlewell, thence to Skipton.

Whitsuntide was, of course, spent in Shropshire. Week-end parties staying in Shrewsbury, Hodnet and Newport, and as usual the racing men at Shawbury.

Some good rides were put in on Sunday, south of Shrewsbury.

In all, 95 members were out in connection with the Invitation "100."

The August Tour to the Antrim Coast and Giant's Causeway was greatly enjoyed by the nine members who took part in it. The report of good roads and glorious scenery may tempt some of the younger members next time Ireland is sampled.

Of course, at this time of the year, the Bath Road "100" and the East Liverpool Wheelers "50" attract a good many of the members.

The Autumnal Tints Tour to Llanarmon on 13th/14th October was again well supported.

22 members and one friend joined in the Tour. On Sunday most of the party went over the Berwyn and had lunch at Corwen.

The All Night Ride was held on 2nd/3rd July. 11 members joined in the ride and all voted it a very easy programme.

Supper was taken at Leek, breakfast at Atherstone, lunch at Newport and tea at Chester.

The alternative Tour at Christmas to Bettws-y-Coed had the support of seven members, of course, at this festive season it is recognised that it is impossible for a good many members to get away from home ties. Nevertheless those who joined the Tour had a real good time.

The best thanks of the Club are due to Mr. T. A. Telford for his work during the past year in connection with the Editorship of the Circular.

In conclusion, Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen, I would like to thank you all for your continued support. I also take this opportunity of thanking Mr. H. Austin for deputising for me on various occasions and also Mr. G. B. Burgess for kindly addressing the envelopes for the *Circular*.

# HON. RACING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in again presenting my Report upon the Club's Racing Programme for 1928. The list of events as arranged for at the last A.G.M. has been carried out successfully, but entries, generally speaking, have been very poor, and must have proved very disappointing to that small band of helpers who are always so willing to turn out to check and assist our racing men.

The first event was a 50 miles Handicap, field on 28th April. The weather conditions were favourable and all the 13 entrants started and finished. G. B. Orrell (Scratch) made the Fastest Time and also took First Handicap with the excellent ride of 2hrs. 19mins. 57secs., N. S. Heath (11mins.) was less than one minute slower on handicap and put up the excellent novice performance of 2hrs. 31mins. 45secs., and E. Nevitt (17 mins.) with an improvement of nearly 4 minutes on his previous best was Third in 2hrs. 38mins. 55secs. Others to finish were H. L. Elston (20 mins.) 2hrs. 45mins. 25secs., A. Hancock (4 mins.), 2hrs. 30mins (8secs., and C. H. McKail (5 mins.), 2hrs. 34mins. 14secs.

The second 50 miles Handicap was run off on 12th May, under perfect weather conditions. Out of the 16 entrants, 14 started and finished. The race was one of the most closely contested we have had for some time, only 51 seconds separating second to seventh places in the handicap. G. A. Glover (20 mins.) was comfortably First in 2hrs. 35mins. 39secs., and H. L. Elston (21 mins.) Second in 2hrs. 39mins. 57secs., both are to be congratulated upon their excellent performances and well deserved their positions in the Handicap. G. B. Orrell (Scratch) was Third and Fastest in 2hrs. 19mins. 8secs., putting up his fastest 50 over the course.

The Invitation " 100" was run off on 28th May; this event appears to grow in popularity each year, on this occasion 188 names were submitted, representing 45 clubs, the standard of merit was much higher than usual and it was an unenviable task for the Committee to select the 100 riders. The outstanding feature of the race was the remarkable fine riding of G. B. Orrell, who at 50 miles was only 19 seconds slower than F. W. Southall (Scratch), Norwood Paragon, who clocked 2hrs. 20mins. 40secs. The two leaders maintained their positions to the finish, but Southall picked up nearly five minutes on Orrell, finishing in 4hrs. 53mins. 26secs., while Orrell was Second Fastest in 4hrs. 58mins. 19secs., and with a Handicap of 20 minutes was also placed second in the Handicap. The First Handicap went to A. Beckinsale (38 mins.), Gomersal O.R.C., surprising even his own club with the excellent ride of 5hrs, 14mins. 18secs., H. Marsh (32 mins.), Bristol South C.C., newcomers to the event, was Third with 5hrs. 11mins. 19secs. Others of "Ours" to finish were A. Hancock (27 mins.), 5hrs. 31mins. 53secs., which is really better than it appears as he punctured twice, and N. S. Heath (38 mins.), 5hrs. 44mins. 46secs. The Team Race proved exceedingly close, 2mins. 8secs. covering four clubs. The First Team Medals going to the Vegetarian C. and A.C., with an aggregate time of 15hrs. 29mins. 22secs., and the Second Team Medals to the Hull Thursday R.C., with an aggregate time of 15hrs. 29mins. 58secs.

The Invitation "24" run off on 20th 21st July attracted an entry of 27, representing nine clubs; from Ours the entry was again disappointing, only eight displaying sufficient interest to compete. All the entrants were started under perfect weather conditions by N. Higham, N.R.R.A. A. Hancock (Ours) took the lead right from the start, closely followed by J. Long (Ours), with J. Smith (Lancashire R.C.), A. E. Edge (Speedwell B.C.), and E. Nevitt (Ours) close up. At 12 hours the distances of the leaders were as follows: A. Hancock, 205½ miles, J. Long, 204 miles, J. Smith, 196 miles, and A. E. Edge, 194½ miles. Hancock riding strongly, further increased his lead, and rode out time with the excellent total of 384 miles. while J. Smith overhauled Long and firmly established himself

in second place and finished with  $368\frac{1}{2}$  miles; Long who had, faded away a little in the second half was Third, with the excellent total of  $362\frac{3}{4}$  miles. Others to finish were A. E. Edge,  $360\frac{1}{4}$  miles, R. McQueen (Cheshire R.C.)  $354\frac{3}{4}$  miles, A. Power (Cheshire R.C.)  $349\frac{1}{2}$  miles, and of Ours, C. Moorby and H. L. Elston qualified for Standard Medals with  $320\frac{1}{2}$  and  $319\frac{1}{2}$  miles respectively.

Our next event was the Club 12 Hours' Handicap, on 18th August, the entries were again disappointing, only 11 riders faced the Timekeeper, of these 10 started and 8 finished. The weather conditions were perfect, and we looked forward to great things from G. B. Orrell (Scratch), unfortunately he had the misfortune to break his chain and lost considerable time before repairs could be effected; even then he was still able to put the creditable distance of 206 miles, obtaining the medal for the Greatest Distance, N. S. Heath (25 miles) was First with the excellent ride of 193 miles, and H. L. Elston was Second with an equally fine ride of 182 miles, both these riders were making their first attempt at a "12," and are to be congratulated upon the splendid results shown. U. Taylor, who always shows such consistent form, finished Third, with the satisfactory total of 1884 miles. Others to finish were C. Randall (18 miles) 1923 miles, H. G. Buckley (30 miles) 1823 miles, while G. A. Glover (22 miles) and A. F. Foy (32 miles) qualified for Standard Medals with  $177\frac{1}{2}$  and  $176\frac{3}{4}$  miles respectively.

The Third "50" was run off on the 1st September, I again regret to report a disappointing entry with only 11 names on the card, and of these, two were non-starters. The outstanding feature was the fine riding of C. H. McKail (9 mins.), who put up the excellent time of 2hrs. 24mins. 51secs., beating G. B. Orrell for Fastest Time by one second. This naturally made a mess of the Handicap, but it is gratifying to know we at last have a man who can press Orrell so closely and give him a run for his money. Second place went to U. Taylor (23 mins.), who practically repeated his previous best, only 9 seconds slower, with the fine ride of 2hrs. 45mins. 29secs., while H. Ladds (16 mins.) was Third in 2hrs. 39mins. 39secs.

We brought our Racing Programme to a close with a 50 Miles Handicap, on 22nd September. The entry of 15 was a slight improvement upon the previous race, unfortunately the race was robbed of some of the interest by four non-starters, otherwise we were treated to another closely contested race. H. G. Buckley (22 mins.), with an improvement of over 8 minutes was First, doing 2hrs. 37mins. 19secs., while G. A. Glover (15 mins.) was only 28 seconds slower on Handicap, and took Second prize with the improved ride of 2hrs. 30mins. 47secs., E. Nevitt also showed a slight improvement and was Third with 2hrs. 35mins. 19secs., while G. B. Orrell (Scratch) was Fastest in 2hrs. 22mins. 14secs.

Turning to Open Events in which we have been represented, it is pleasing to note our riders have well maintained the Club's reputation. In the Manchester Wheelers' "59," held on 16th June, G. B. Orrell was unable to enter, while A. Hancock and E. Nevitt were non-starters owing to indisposition. J. Long and N. S. Heath were our only finishers, with rides of 2hrs. 36mins. 18secs. and 2hrs. 37mins. 10secs, respectively.

We had a more successful day in the Grosvenor Wheelers' "100," on 30th June; G. B. Orrell treated us to another outstanding performance, securing Fastest Time and the Second Handicap with the excellent time of 4hrs. 57mins. 15secs., this along with A. Hancock's 5hrs. 29mins, 52secs. and C. H. McKail's 5hrs. 39mins. 25secs. also secured for us the Team Medals.

In the East Liverpool Wheelers' "50," on 6th August, we were deprived of the assistance of G. B. Orrell, however, we were well represented by C. H. McKail, N. S. Heath, A. E. Burge, and H. Ladds. C. H. McKail put up the good time of 2hrs. 27mins. 12secs. while N. S. Heath and A. E. Burge showed improved form with 2hrs. 30mins. 57secs. and 2hrs. 30mins. 43secs. respectively. These figures, good as they were, unfortunately were not quite good enough to get places.

After a lapse of a few years we are again represented in the Speedwell "100," on August Bank Holiday, on this occasion we had three riding, although none were among the prizes, they

all qualified for Club Standard Medals: J. Long, 5hrs. 22mins. 58secs., G. A. Glover 5hrs. 29mins. 26secs., and E. Nevitt 5hrs. 40mins. 2secs.

For the first time we competed in the Palatine "50," on 9th September, G. B. Orrell rode extremely well and clocked 2hrs. 16mins. 32secs., but was only fourth fastest; C. H. McKail showed a continuance of his improving form and did 2hrs. 21mins. 20secs., while J. Long and G. A. Glover did 2hrs. 32mins. 11secs. and 2hrs. 37mins. 3secs. respectively. Unfortunately none of these performances brought us anywhere into the picture—C. H. McKail's ride, good as it was, only brought him 10th in handicap.

In the North Road "24," on 31st August/Ist September, our only representative was J. Long, who, although going well at 251 miles and with 7½ hours to go was forced to retire owing to muscle trouble.

Of the six attempts on Records only two have been successful. On the 17th June, G. Molyneux attempted the Liverpool London Bicycle Record, the prospects, with a strong N.W. wind the previous day, looked distinctly promising, unfortunately this backed to the West and Molyneux was forced to retire at Coleshill.

On 15th July, G. B. Orrell and C. H. McKail beat the N.R.R.A. 50 miles Tandem Record, putting up the excellent time of lhr. 56mins, 10secs., beating the admittedly hot Torry and Dawes record by Imin. 44secs.

On 12th August, G. B. Orrell beat the long-standing N.R.R.A. 100 miles Safety Record; Orrell started very fast and was well inside schedule up to 50 miles, which took exactly 2hrs. 18mins., after that he slowed somewhat, but kept well inside record and finished in the excellent time of 4hrs. 56mins. 20secs., beating the old record by 10mins. 53secs.

On 16th September, G. Molyneux made a further attempt on the Liverpool/London R.R.A. Bicycle Record, but as on the previous occasion the wind went right round during the night and he was forced to abandon the attempt early on.

On 21st October, G. Molyneux attempted to regain for us the Liverpool/London Tricycle Record, so long held by Fulton. He experienced unfortunately no better luck than on his previous attempts. An adverse wind amounting to also gale force brought about an early retirement.

On the same day, A. Hancock attempted to stiffen the N.R.R.A. 12 Hours' Bicycle Record already held by E. Buckley, but was forced to abandon the attempt owing to the adverse conditions.

In conclusion, my thanks and more especially the thanks of the Club are to the same small band of helpers who turn out for event after event and without whose assistance it would be impossible to carry out our Racing Programme.

The Hon. General Secretary having read his Report for the past year. E. J. Cody moved, and W. T. Venables seconded, and it was resouved—

"That the Report of the General Hon. Secretary be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be accorded him for his services to the Club during the past year."

The Hon. Racing Secretary having read his Report for the past year, R. H. Carlisle moved, and J. Long seconded, and it was resolved—

"That the Report of the Hon. Racing Secretary be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be accorded him for his services to the Club during the past year."

The Hon. Treasurer having read his Report for the past year, W. C. Humphreys moved, and S. H. Bailey seconded, and it was resolved—

C. J. Conway proposed, and W. T. Venables seconded, and it was resolved

"That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed."

R. J. Austin proposed, and R. H. Carlisle seconded, and it was resolved—

"That an alternative Tour at Easter be to the Welsh Border."

W. H. Kettle proposed, and R. Rothwell seconded, and it was  ${\tt RESOLVED-}$ 

"That the destination of an All Night Ride be left to the Committee."

F. Chandler proposed, and A. Davies seconded, and it was  ${\tt RESOLVEL-}$ 

"That the August Tour be to Llanidloes for the Welsh Border."
The President proposed, and W. E. Taylor seconded, and it was resolved—

"That a Special Vote of Thanks be accorded to T. A. Telford for the way in which he has edited the *Circular* during the past year."

The President reported that R. A. Fulton's offer of Special Prizes, value Eight Guineas, was still open.

The meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers, Hon. General Scoretary, and Hon. Racing Secretary;



### RULES.

- 1.—The Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."
- The Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

#### Officers.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

#### Committee.

The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members including the Officers.

#### Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine, and report upon, the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

#### Meetings.

- 6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance-Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.
- 7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.
- 8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in

writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary tails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.

- 9.—Six days notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.
- 10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.
- 11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted urgent by two-thirds of the Members present.
- 12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made "in propria persona" by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.
- 13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.
- 14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.
- 15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

- 16.-No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.
- 17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.
- 18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

#### Full Membership.

- 19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accompanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly Circular issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.
- 20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

#### Life Membership.

21 —A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any

Member of 15 years standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Full Membership.

#### Honorary Membership.

- 22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to, be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.
- 23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the long-distance prizes or in any of the closed events.
- 24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

#### Subscriptions, &c.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shillings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscrip-

tion for Junior Full Members shall be-for those under 18 years of age 5/-, and for those between 18 and 21 years of age 15/-, together with the Entrance Fee of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription. but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

#### Resignations &c.

- 26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.
- 27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

#### Finance.

- 28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club: the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.
- 29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December in each year.

#### Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours; Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

#### Committee.

- 31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.
- 32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.
- 33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

No. 3.—No Member will be entitled to more than one Standard Medal at the end of the year in each of the Classes, that is Bicycle, Tricycle, and Tandems (Bicycle and Tricycle) 30 miles, 100 miles, twelve hours, and 24 hours each—such medal being for the longest distance, or best time during the year. Previous winners barred.

The Unpaced Standards do not constitute a separate class as compared with Paced or accompanied Standards.

No. 4.—A Gold Medal, value Two Guineas, will be awarded to any first-claim Member who succeeds in heating any of the Road Records, and/or Northern Road Records for the time being, the ride to be proved to the satisfaction of the Road Records Association and/or Northern Road Records Association, as the case may be.

A Special Prize value Five Guineas in lieu of the usual Gold Medal will be awarded to any first-claim Member who succeeds in beating any of the Unpaced Place to Place Records recognised by the Road Records Association, and not made and held by a first-claim Member (or Members) of the Anfield Bicycle Club. Tandem riders to divide the Prize as per Rule 6.

A Member who succeeds in beating a Record more than once shall be entitled to a Medal for the highest performance ONLY at each distance during the year. This Rule does not apply to the Special Place to Place Record Prizes.
