

HON. GEN. SECRETARY'S REPORT,

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members, 11th January, 1930.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN.

I have much pleasure in presenting my Report of the Club's social and touring activities for the year 1929.

The Membership now numbers 201—an increase of 5 since last year. This figure is composed of 151 Full, 9 Junior Full and 41 Honorary Members. 8 New Members have been elected during the year, viz., 4 Full and 4 Junior Full. In addition 4 Old members have rejoined the Honorary List. One resignation has been accepted and three names have been struck off.

It is with sincere regret I have to record the death of three members during the past year, *viz.*, Mr. W. R. Toft, Mr. Arthur Hancock and Mr. A. Pollard.

The passing of Mr. W. R. Toft was one of the most serious losses the Club has experienced in the whole of its existence.

By the death of Mr. Arthur Hancock the Club lost a very valuable racing member.

Mr. Arthur Pollard, although personally unknown to a good many of the younger members, had been a member since 1887.

There is still room for improvement in the attendances at the Fixtures. I would again appeal to all members to attend as often as possible.

There have been 53 Fixtures during the year, with an average attendance of 39, a decrease of one over 1928. Quarterly average attendances were—January to March, 40; April to June, 44: July to September, 41, and October to December, 33.

The highest attendance was as usual at the Invitation "100," when 96 members turned out. The lowest attendance was 24 at Helsby on the 23rd November.

Two members, Messrs. W. P. Cook and W. H. Kettle, have attended all the runs during 1929.

Mr. T. Royden takes the first Attendance Prize for the third year in succession with a score of 52. Mr. H. Green takes the second Attendance Prize with 48 runs to his credit.

During the past year Mr. E. J. Cody completed his 1,000 runs and I tender to him, on behalf of the Club, our heartiest congratulations. Individual attendances at Club fixtures during the year are as follows :---

THE CLUB TOURS .- These have been fully reported in the Circular so it only remains for me to give short particulars.

Bettws-y-Coed was again chosen for the Easter Tour with Headquarters as usual at the Glan Aber. Perfect summer weather prevailed practically the whole time. In all, 26 members and eight friends participated in the tour. The daily runs were well attended, *viz.*, 19 at Llanfairtalhaiarn on Good Friday; 23 at Criccieth on Saturday and 27 at Rhydyfen on Sunday. Nine members lunched at Denbigh on Monday.

The Welsh Border was chosen as the alternative Easter Tour and it had the support of 13 members. Thursday evening found the tourists at Wem. Lunch was taken at Chirbury on Good Friday, then on to Clun for the night. Lunch at Weobley on Saturday and thence to Abergavenny for the night. Lunch was taken at Hay on Sunday, returning to Clun again for the evening. On Monday, lunch was taken at Shrewsbury.

WHITSUNTIDE was more impressive than usual on account of the Jubilee Celebrations at Shrewsbury. Our Jubilee and the Banquet has already been fully reported by a more abler pen than mine, and it only remains for me to say that 116 members and friends spent a most enjoyable evening together. Good rides were done by some on the Sunday.

Monday was gloriously fine and 96 members were out in connection with the Invitation "100."

The AUGUST TOUR to Llanidloes and the Welsh Border was only supported by eight members, although it was proposed to sample entirely new country. Bank Holiday racing undoubtedly affects the attendance at this fixture. The Tour was rather a strenuous one but was thoroughly enjoyed.

The AUTUMNAL TINTS TOUR to Llanarmon on 19/20th October was again a great success. 29 members and two friends had a very enjoyable time. Various routes were taken on Sunday, parties lunching at Corwen, Ruthin and Malpas.

The ALL NIGHT RIDE was held on 677th July. Supper was taken at Eccleshall, breakfast at Tenbury, lunch at Shrewsbury and tea at Pulford. The support given to this fixture was very disappointing.

The alternative Tour at Christmas to Bettws-y-Coed had the support of nine members. Although there were only two cyclists in the party, some very good daily rides were carried out. There is no doubt that the Pestive Season interferes with this fixture.

The best thanks of the Club are due to Mr. E. Nevitt and Mr. J. S. Jonas in connection with the Editorship of the *Circular*. In October, Mr. Nevitt was obliged to resign the Editorship on account of change of residence and Mr. J. S. Jonas was appointed his successor.

In conclusion I wish to thank you all for the support you have given to me during the year, and I also extend my thanks to Mr. Burgess for again addressing the envelopes for the *Circular*, also to Mr. Lucas and Mr. Glover for deputising for me on various occasions.

HON. RACING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in again presenting my Report upon the Club's Racing Programme for 1929. All the events, as arranged for at the last A.G.M., have been carried out successfully; while the performances generally speaking have been very good, it is to be regretted that the number of entries for the various events do not show any increase.

The first event was a 50 miles Handicap, held on 20th April, this only attracted an entry of 13, of whom 11 started and 10 finished. The First Handicap Prize went to G. A. Glover (11 mins.) with the improved ride of 2hrs. 30mins. 22secs., G. Molyneux (15 mins) was Second with 2hrs. 37mins. 5secs., and E. Nevitt (15 mins.) Third, with 2hrs. 38mins. Isec. Fastest Time went to G. B. Orrell (Scratch), who, despite a puncture, put the creditable time of 2hrs. 23mins. 56secs.

The second 50 miles Handicap was run off on 4th May, and like the first, showed a disappointing entry. G. B. Orrell (Scratch) was First and Fastest with the excellent ride of 2hrs. 19mins. 8secs., C. H. McKail (4 mins.), who put up his fastest "50" over the Club course, was Second in 2hrs. 23mins. 55secs., and G. A. Glover (10 mins.), who was again unlucky to miss evens by a few seconds, was Third in 2hrs. 30mins. 39secs.

Our next event was the Invitation "100," run off on Whit Monday 20th May. On this occasion the Committee decided, in the best interests of the sport, to extend invitations only to those who were prepared to compete in events where the number of entries did not exceed 100. The natural outcome of this was to bar a few who competed in events run by Associations of Cycling Clubs, who place no restrictions on the numbers competing. Despite this condition, over 150 names were submitted and, if anything, the standard of merit was higher than in 1928.

An innovation this year was a Third Fastest Time Prize, so it now became a Scratch race as well as a Handicap. Fastest Time and Second Handicap went to A. West (10 mins.), Bath Road, who punctured at 40 miles and at half way was only ninth fastest ; he finished very fast and put up the excellent figures of 4hrs. 51mins. 18secs., C. Marshall (Scratch), Vegetarian C.C., was Second Fastest in 4hrs. 55mins. 14secs., and G. B. Orrell (4 mins.) "Ours," was Third Fastest, with the fine ride of 4hrs. 58mins. 15secs. The First Handicap went to J. Pitchford (25 mins.) " Ours," who, riding his first 100, and displaying excellent indument, finished in 5hrs. 5mins. 27secs., beating West by 51 seconds. The Third Handicap went to W. R. Kidd (30 mins.), Irish R.C., with the fine ride of 5hrs. 12mins. 29secs. First Team Medals went to the Vegetarian C. & A.C., with the aggregate time of 15hrs. 19mins. 16secs., and the Second Team Medals to "Ours," with the aggregate time of 15hrs. 27mins, 13secs.

The Invitation 24 Hours' Road Ride was run off on 19th/ 20th July, and from an entry point of view was distinctly disappointing, 17 names appeared on the card, representing 11 clubs, and of these only three were "Ours." There were two non-starters and the rest were dispatched under perfect conditions by H. Poole, R.R.A., N.R.R.A. The day turned out very hot and the cause of many retirements, including F. Hancock, who had ridden 2073 miles in the first 12 hours. The second half developed into a duel between A. Power (Cheshire R.C.) and N. S. Heath (" Ours ") for first place, at the end of the 24 hours Power ran out time with the excellent total of 3714 miles and Heath was Second with the equally fine total of 371 miles, while E. W. Robinson (Palatine C.C.) was Third with the creditable distance of 3641 miles. Our other finisher was C. Raudall, with 323 miles, which placed him fourth and J. Long retired with knee trouble at The Raven.

The 12 Hours Club Handicap was run off on 17th August, entries showing a little improvement on last year. The outstanding feature was the improved form shown by G. A. Glover (14 miles), who took the First Handicap and Greatest Distance Prizes with the fine total of $205\frac{1}{2}$ miles. This distance was actually exceeded by J. Pitchford by half a mile, but as about five miles was done off the course, for handicapping purposes he was only credited with 201 miles. Second Handicap went to A. E. Walters and F. L. Street (owe 5 miles) on a tandem, with 211 miles, while the Third Handicap went to C. H. McKail (12 miles), with 1963 miles.

The concluding event of our Racing Programme was the 50 miles Handicap on 14th September ; as usual this was the best supported of the series and provided a most interesting race. J. S. Jonas (25 mins.), a novice at the distance, put up the excellent time of 2brs. 38mins. 45secs. and easily obtained the First Handicap, H. L. Elston (21 mins.) was Second, with the improved ride of 2brs. 36mins. 31secs., and R. Poole (25 mins.), as a result of systematic training, was Third, with the fine ride of 2brs. 41mins. 9secs. G. B. Orrell was Fastest, with the wonderful ride of 2brs. 17mins. 12secs., which is nearly two minutes faster than he has done previously in these events and notwithstanding the fact that he punctured at 48 miles and finished on the rim.

Our riders have figured in over a dozen "Opens" this year, and the fine riding of Orrell, McKail, Pitchford and Glover, either individually or as teams, has put the Club well in the limelight. On Easter Monday, 1st April, C. H. McKail won the First Handicap in the Leicester R.C. "25," with the fine ride of Ihr. 10mins. 20secs.

The Dukinfield "50," on 28th April found our riders well among the prizes; G. B. Orrell secured Third Fastest with the fine ride of 2hrs. 20mins. 39sees., and J. Pitchford the Second Handicap, these along with C. H. McKail's ride of 2hrs. 25mins. 4sees., were good enough to win the Second Team Prizes.

In the Andy Wilson Memorial " 50," on 2nd June, G. B. Orrell, with a 35 seconds late start, was Third Fastest with the fine ride of 2hrs. 15mins. 25secs., and C. H. McKail, with a two minute late start did 2hrs. 21mins. 12secs., while J. Pitchford was only a few seconds slower in 2hrs. 21mins. 38secs. Despite the time lost through starting late they only lost the First Team Prizes to the Vorkshire R.C. by two seconds.

Although we had six riding in the Manchester Wheelers' 50," on 15th June, the performances were disappointing, with the exception of G. B. Orrell, who took the Third Fastest Time Prize with 2hrs. 17mins. 53secs.

In the Apollo Wheelers' "50," on 30th June, G. B. Orrelf was Second Fastest in 2hrs. 20mins. 54secs., and with Pitchford and McKail doing 2hrs. 27mins. 20secs. and 2hrs. 27mins. 40 secs. respectively, they secured the First Team Prizes.

In the Grosvenor Wheelers' "100," on 30th June, G. B. Orrell rode his fastest "100" over a northern course, securing Fastest Time with the fine ride of 4hrs. 45mins 22secs... and the Second Handicap, this with J. Pitchford's 5hrs. 5mins., and G. A. Glover's 5hrs. 22mins., constituted the winning team.

G. B. Orrell was selected to ride in the North Road Memorial "50," on 14th July. He had the misfortune to lose a lot of time owing to a faulty brake and his ride of 2hrs. 19mins. 30secs. was excellent under the circumstances.

In the Bath Road "100," on 5th August, our two representatives are to be congratulated ; G. B. Orrell riding his fastest "100" in 4hrs. 44mins. 12sees., which placed him fifth fastest, and J. Pitchford for beating "evens," with 4hrs. 55mins. 20secs.

In the Palatine "50," on 1st September, G. B. Orrell would have been undoubtedly fastest but for a fall at one of the corners, his line ride of 2hrs. 14mins. 15secs. being only four seconds slower than Fastest Time. The fine riding of C. H. McKail and J. Pitchford with 2hrs. 18mins. 58secs., and 2hrs. 19mins. 29secs. respectively, making the Team's aggregate of 6hrs. 52mins. 36secs., which was good enough to win the First Teams' Medals and Vice-President's Shield to be held for one year.

My Report would not be complete without placing on record our pleasure at the inclusion of G. B. Orrell in the Team for the World's Road Championship, although Orrell was the reserve I am sure if he had been called upon to ride he would have fully justified his claim to selection.

There have been only three attempts upon records this year two of which were successful. On the 22nd September, G. B. Orrell beat the long-standing N.R.R.A. 12 Hours' Safety Record held by E. Buckley, with the excellent ride of $231\frac{1}{2}$ miles. On 29th September, G. A. Glover and E. Nevitt beat the N.R.R.A. 12 Hours' Tandem Bicycle Record held by F. H. Harrison and J. J. Barker, Manchester Wheelers. Their total of $229\frac{3}{2}$ miles is specially good seeing they were more or less a scratch tandem pair and had little opportunity of training together.

In conclusion, my thanks are due to those who have turned out for the purposes of checking, etc., without whose assistance it would be impossible to carry out our Racing Programme.

That the Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be : For those under 18 years of age, 5/- per annum; and for those between 18 and 21 years of age, 15/- per annum; together with the Entrance Fee of 5/- in all cases, and that a Prize Fund be continued."

A. Dickman and T. Royden were appointed Scrutineers.

W. P. Cook, proposed by J. Kinder, and seconded by T. E. Mandall, was re-elected President.

W. T. Venables, proposed by the President, and seconded by R. H. Carlisle, was re-elected a Vice-President. It was RESOLVED by Ballot that C. H. Turnor be elected a Vice-President.

W. H. Kettle, proposed by E. Edwards, and seconded by T. Royden, was re-elected Captain and Hon. Racing Secretary.

J. Long, proposed by A. Dickman and seconded by J. S. Jonas, was re-elected a Sub-Captain.

A. Davies, proposed by R. J. Austin, and seconded by R. H. Carlisle, was re-elected a Sub-Captain.

R. Leigh Knipe, proposed by C. J. Conway, and seconded by F. Chandler, was re-elected Hon. Treasurer.

H. W. Powell, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. General Secretary,

It was RESOLVED by Ballot that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee : S. J. Buck, R. H. Carlisle, E. Edwards, H. L. Elston, G. A. Glover, J. S. Jonas, J. Kinder, A. Lucas, G. B. Mercer, and C. Ramdall.

E. O. Morris and W. E. Cotter, proposed by A. T. Simpson, and seconded by E. J. Cody, were re-elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1930.

W. H. Kettle proposed, and J. Long seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Club's Racing Programme for 1930 consist of the Invitation '100,' a 12 Hours' Handicap, an Invitation '24,' and three 50 miles races. Also a Club '100,' or another 50 miles race at the discretion of the Committee."

C. J. Conway proposed, and W. T. Venables seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed."

R. J. Austin proposed, and R. H. Carlisle seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That an alternative Tour at Easter be held, the destinaation being left to the Committee." The President proposed, and F. Chandler-seconded, and it was-RESOLVED—

"That the August Tour be to the Lake District, with Headquarters at Coniston."

The President proposed and it was RESOLVED-

"That a Special Vote of Thanks be accorded to E. Nevitt and J. S. Jonas for the way in which they had edited the *Circular* during the past year."

R. L. Knipe proposed, and W. T. Venables seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That a Medal be presented to T. Royden as a memento of his having won the first attendance prize for three years in succession."

R. L. Knipe proposed, and R. J. Austin seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Medal to be presented to T. Royden shall be a Club Gold Medal."

The President reported that R. A. Fulton's offer of Special Prizes, value Eight Guineas, was still open.

The meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers, Hon. General Secretary, and Hou. Racing Secretary.

RULES.

1.—The Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB." 2.—The Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

Officers.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

Committee.

4.-The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members including the Officers.

Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine, and report upon, the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

Meetings.

6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.

7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.

9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.

10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.

11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted URGENT by two-thirds of the Members present.

12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made in *proprio persona* by the said Member. and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.

13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.

14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.

15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

16 .- No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.

17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.

18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

Full Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accomppanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly *Circular* issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude ; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member of 15 years' standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Full Membership.

Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to, be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the longdistance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

Subscriptions, etc.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shiftings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be—for those under 18 years of age 5/-; and for those between 18 and 21 years of age 15/-, together with the Entrance Fee of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

Resignations, etc.

26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.

27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

Finance.

28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club : the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December in each year.

Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours; Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

Committee.

31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.

32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.

33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the wellbeing of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

No. 7.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same performance. No 50 or 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No. 11.—Motor pacing is entirely barred. In attempts for unpaced Standard Medals, followers are not allowed to approach the rider within 100 yards.

No. 12.—All Prizes and Medals will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who shall have full power to decide any question which may arise as to the interpretation or application of the rules.
