## HON. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members, 6th January, 1934.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in presenting my Report of the Club's social and touring activities for the year 1933.

The Membership now numbers 187, a decrease of 9 since last year. This figure is composed of 135 Full, 7 Junior Full, and 45 Honorary Members.

3 New Full Members have been elected during the year. 5 Resignations have been accepted, *viz.*: 3 Full, 1 Junior Full, and 1 Honorary. 2 names have been struck off, *viz.*: 1 Full and 1 Junior Full.

It is with sincere regret that I have to record the death of 5 members during the year, *viz.* : Mr. A. Davies, Mr. Laurence Fletcher, Mr. R. H. Carlisle, Mr. F. Gee and Mr. T. B. Conway,

Mr. A DAVIES joined the Club in 1919. His death was a great shock to us all. He was devoted to the Club, and a wholehearted supporter of the Club Runs, and is sadly missed. He was a Member of the Committee, 1926/1928, a Sub-Captain 1929/30, and a Vice-President from 1931.

Mr. LAURENCE FLETCHER joined the Club in 1882. His death was the most serious loss the Club has sustained since its formation. Although he had not appeared among us for many years he was always with us in spirit. He played the biggest part in founding our reputation for long distance riding on the road. Twice he won our "24" on a bicycle, and won the End to End Record in 1885 and 1892. He will always be remembered as the man who saved the Club at the most critical time of its history.

Mr. R. H. CARLISLE joined the Club in 1887, and was promminent in all its activities for a number of years. His interest in the Club and road sport persisted to the end. In 1892 he won both the London-Edinburgh and the Liverpool-Edinburgh Records, and in 1894 was successful in gaining the End to End Record.

Mr. FRED GEE joined the Club in 1900. Although he had not been with us for many years he took great pride in the successes of the racing members and always had the welfare of the Club at heart.

Mr. T. B. CONWAY joined the Club in 1884. Another of the old brigade gone, and a grievous loss to the Club. A racing man for 15 years. He broke the N.R.R.A. 24 Hour Bicycle Record in 1894, and gained the Liverpool-Edinburgh record in 1897. His loyalty to the Club was remarkable.

There have been 53 Fixtures during the year, with an average attendance of 34 018, a decrease of 7.74 compared with 1932. Quarterly average attendances were : January to March, 32.333 ; April to June, 41.384 ; July to September, 33.857, and October to December, 28.785.

"100," when 75 members were out. The lowest attendance was at Acton Bridge, on 25th February, when only 16 members were out.

Mr. H. Green's total attendances at Club runs now number 1,054, and I tender to him on behalf of the Club our heartiest congratulations. At the end of 1932, Mr. Green had registered 1,006 runs, but evidently he was too modest to mention the fact. Mr. D. C. Rowatt has attended 52 runs and therefore gains the First Attendance Prize.

Mr. E. J. Cody has attended 50 runs and gains the Second Attendance Prize,

A general exodus on the Sunday for the Bath Road Race left a select party of 9 on Sunday night. AUTUMNAL TINTS TOUR to Llanarmon D.C., on 21/22nd October, attracted 31 members. The West Arms was again full, some members having to seek accommodation outside. The weather was again excellent.

## HON. RACING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

#### MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you my Report of the Club's Racing activities for 1933. The Programme, as adopted at the last Annual General Meeting, has been carried out successfully.

The First " 50 " was run off on the 29th April ander bad weather conditions and attracted an entry of 16, of whom 14 started and 12 finished. The First Handicap went to F. A. Brewster (20mins.) with a fine novice performance of 2hrs. 29mins. 59secs. J. J. Salt (scratch) gained Second Handicap with 2hrs. 15mins. 59secs., which was also Fastest Time, while G. B. Orrell (4mins.) was Third with 2hrs. 20mins. 17secs.

The Second "50" was held on 20th May and attracted an entry of 17, of whom 16 started and 15 finished. The weather conditions were again disappointing, a strong wind blowing over the course. Fastest Time was made by J. J. Salt (scratch) with the good ride, for the day, of 2hrs. 21mins. 26secs. First Handicap went to G. B. Orrell (4mins.) with 2hrs. 22mins. 5secs. W. G. Connor (11mins.) secured the Second Handicap with 2hrs. 29mins. 29secs., while F. E. Marriott (7mins.) won the Third Handicap with 2hrs. 25mins. 57secs.

Our next event was the Invitation "100," run off on Whit-Monday, 5th June. The day turned out to be very hot, but in spite of this, some very fine times were recorded. I am very pleased to report that G. B. Orrell (2mins.), "ours" returned the Fastest and Record Time for the Course of 4hrs. 45mins. 37secs.; Second Fastest Time was made by C. Marshall (scratch), Vegetarian C. & A.C., who did 4hrs. 47mins. 22secs.; this time only missed beating previous course record by I second. Third Fastest was J. J. Salt (scratch), "ours," who did 4hrs. 50mins. 16secs., which was his fastest time over the course. S. St. John (21mins.), Dukinfield C.C., took First Handicap with 5hrs. 0mins. 4sees. : Second Handicap went to G. H. Dawson (18mins.), Victoria C.C., with 4hrs. 58mins. 36secs. ; W. G. Connor (30mins.), " Ours," riding his first " 100," did the splendid ride of 5hrs. 12mins. 54sees., and so gained Third Handicap. J. Pitchford (3mins.), " Ours," went round in 4hrs. 56mins. 17secs., and this time added to those of Orrell and Salt aggregated 14hrs. 32mins. 40sees., which gained for us the First Team Medals. The Second Team Medals were won by the Potteries C.C. riders : T. E. Godwin (4mins.), 4hrs. 50mins. 40secs.; F. T. Brown (2mins.), 4hrs. 53mins. 9secs., and J. E. Carr (12mins.), 4hrs. 59mins. 47secs., the aggregate time being 14hrs, 43mins, 36secs. Of our other men, J. S. Jonas (20mins.) did 5hrs. 14mins. 20secs. ; D. L. Ryalls (25mins.). 5hrs. 14mins. 41secs.; F. E. Marriott (16mins.), 5hrs. 19mins. 30secs.; F. A. Brewster, also riding in his first " 100," did 5hrs. 21mins, 9secs. G. Lockett (24mins), unfortunately crashed, but in spite of a badly bruised shoulder and some cuts, he pluckily finished the course, doing 5hrs. 33mins. 14secs.

The Third "50" was run off on 17th June and attracted an entry of 14, of whom 12 started and finished. The weather conditions were again far from ideal. R. Poole (28mins.) gained First Handicap with 2hrs. 41mins. 23sees.; R. J. Pugh (18mins.) won Second Handicap with 2hrs. 34mins. 35sees., and A. E. C. Birkby (20mins.) improved nearly 3mins., doing 2hrs. 36mins. 50sees., and shared the Third Handicap prize with J. S. Jonas (7mins.) who did 2hrs. 23mins. 50sees. Fastest Time was made by G. B. Orrell (scratch) in 2hrs. 18mins, 13sees.

The Invitation 24 Hours Road Ride was held on 14th/15th July, and shewed a reduction in entry on that of last year, there being 17 names on the card, but what we lacked in quantity we gained in quality—four previous winners being amongst the entry in the persons of F. Hancock (Mauchester Grosvenor Wheelers), W. T. Melia (Mersey Roads Club), G. H. M. Pitt (North Road C.C.), and A. J. Power (Cheshire Roads Club)—in view of

this a very close race was anticipated. At 12 hours the approximate distances of the leaders were : Gilbert 204 miles, Hancock 203 miles, Pitt 201 miles, Melia 201 miles, R. Hepworth (Huddersfield R.C.) 1991 miles, and T. W. Heginbotham (Manchester Wednesday C.C.) 199 miles. At 2321 miles Hancock was in the lead, followed by Melia, Gilbert, Pitt and Heginbotham. Power retired at this point. The second half of the race saw the retirement of Hancock and Gilbert, also our only representative, J. S. Jonas, who had not been able to find his usual form. At 274 miles. Melia was now leading, followed by Hancock, who had not yet retired, and Pitt. At 353 miles Melia was still leading. but Pitt, who had started one minute behind him and had dropped away earlier in the race, was now making a fine effort to catch him and was less than a mile behind. At 388 miles Melia had again drawn away from Pitt who was now 9 minutes behind. The positions were now unchanged to the finish, Melia running out time with the magnificent total of 401 miles, which is the first time that 400 miles has been beaten unpaced on Northern Roads. Pitt amassed the splendid total of 398 miles, beating his distance of last year by 31 miles. Hepworth ran into third place with 3893 miles. Of the 17 entries, all started and 11 finished.

The next event was the Invitation 12 Hours Road Ride, run off on 19th Angust, and attracted an entry of 24. This must be considered satisfactory considering that it was a new fixture on R.R.C. Jist, also in view of another "12" being held on the following day, in the immediate neighbourhood. 14 of the names on the card were of "Ours." The day was not of the best, a strong wind making several parts of the course severely hard. The check at 56 showed T. E. Godwin (Potteries C.C.) leading with 2hrs. 42mins., followed by J. E. Carr, also of the Potteries C.C., with 2hrs. 46mins., these were closely followed by J. J. Salt and G. B. Orrell of "Ours," with 2hrs. 46mins. 30secs. and 2hrs. 47mins, respectively. At 95 miles Carr had obtained the lead with 4hrs. 45mins., followed by Gowdin in 4hrs. 49mins. Salt still third with 4hrs. 50mins., had drawn further away from Orrell, who was doing 4hrs. 54mins. At 1594 miles, Godwin had retired with a damaged machine, while Carr had to borrow another machine. Salt was now level with Carr, both doing Shrs. 25mins. followed by Orrell in Shrs. 35mins. F. A. Brewster (" Ours "), who was doing a splendid ride in his first "12," was next past this point in Shrs. 44mins. At 1974 miles Salt was now leading with 10hrs. 35mins., Carr. second, 10hrs. 43mins., and Orrell, third, 10hrs. 50mins. These positions were maintained to the end. Salt finished with 223 miles, Carr with 2201 miles and Orrell with 2181 miles. Brewster had dropped to sixth place at the finish with 2153 miles, being displaced by G. H. Dawson (Victoria C.C.), 2171 miles, and W. G. Connor (" Ours ") with 216 miles. The First Three places in the Club Handicap run in conjunction with the Scratch Race were filled by F. A. Brewster (25 miles), First; W. G. Connor (20 miles), Second, and W. H. Lloyd (35 miles). Third, who covered 2003 miles.

The Fourth "50" and the concluding event in our Racing Frogramme was held on 16th September. A strong southerly wind prevented high speeds and all times were below the usual standard. The absence of J. Pitchford and G. B. Orrell from the 14 names on the card, made Fastest time almost a certainty for J. J. Salt (scratch) who did 2hrs. 20mins. 25secs. E. Haynes, Junior (17mins.) won First Handicap with 2hrs. 32mins. 19secs., R. J. Pugh (18mins.) was second in 2hrs. 36mins. 10secs., W. H. Lloyd (21mins.) went round in 2hrs. 40mins. 36secs. and gained Third Handicap. Eleven of the 14 entries started and finished.

The reputation of the Club has been sustained in the Open Events in which we have been represented, and many fine rides have been recorded, and as these have been fully detailed in the *Circular* I shall only refer to those in which we have been the more successful.

In the Dukinfield C.C. "50," on 14th May, J. J. Salt was Fourth Fastest in 2hrs. 13mins. 4secs., and this time, along with those of G. B. Orrell and J. Pitchford, secured the Second Team Medals. In the East Liverpool Wheelers' "50," on 11th June, our riders won the Second Team Medals.

In the Brooklands Race, organised by the Charlottville C.C., on 17th June, our only representative, J. J. Salt, won in 2hrs. 55mins. 53 2-5secs, over the distance of 100 kilometres (623) and won the Trophy presented by *Cycling*. He also won the Dunlop Trophy for the Liverpool District Team in company with L. J. Ross of the East Liverpool Wheelers' C.C. who finished eighth.

In the Manchester Grosvenor Wheelers' "100," on 25th June, J. J. Salt was Second Fastest in 4hrs. 46mins, 49secs,

In the Manchester Wheelers' Scratch " 50 " Team Race on 2nd July, J. J. Salt made fastest individual time with 2hrs. 12mins. 56secs., and we won Second Team Prize with an aggregate of 6hrs. 46mins. 39secs., G. B. Orrell and J. Pitchford doing 2hrs. 16mins. 16secs. and 2hrs. 17mins. 27secs. respectively.

In the Apollo Wheelers' " 50," on 9th July, G. B. Orrell made Second Fastest Time in 2hrs. 17mins, 7sees., J. Pitchford was Third Fastest in 2hrs. 17mins, 14secs., and we won First Team Medals.

In the Warrington Road Club "100," on 16th July, J. Pitchford was Fastest in 4hrs. 40mins. 24sees., J. J. Salt was Second Fastest in 4hrs. 42mins, 16secs., and we won the First Team Prizes.

In the Rover R.C.C. " 50," on 29th July, J. Pitchford was Second Fastest in 2hrs. 14mins, 35secs.

In the Bath Road Club Scratch " 100," on 7th Angust. J. J. Salt was Second Fastest, beating Competition Record by doing 4hrs 32mins, 9secs., which is 3mins, 44secs, less than his winning time of last year. In spite of this splendid time, F. W. Southall, of the Norwood Paragon C.C., was Fastest in 4hrs, 30mins, 10secs., at which figure Competition Record now stands. J. Pitchford, although not so fit for the race as last year, did the fine ride of 4hrs, 43mins, 56secs., F. E. Marriott did 4hrs, 55mins, 39secs., and G. B. Orrell retired through punctures. I am pleased to report that J. J. Salt was chosen as one of the team to represent England in the World's Amateur Championship Road Race, in Paris, on 14th August. Some of his equipment proved to be unsuitable for the race and he experienced other trouble, otherwise I am sure he would have been very much higher up than 21st in the list of finishers.

In the Manchester Wheelers' "12," on 12th September, J. J. Salt was Third with 2297 miles.

In Cycling's Best All-Rounder Competition, J. I. Salt was sixth with an average of 21,291 m.p.h.

I regret I am not able to report any record attempts during the current year.

In conclusion I wish to thank all those who have helped to carry out our Racing Programme with success by Checking, Marshalling, etc., and by providing transport for our Racing men to Open events when possible.

Roskell, D. C. Rowatt, T. Royden, J. J. Salt, W. H. Scarff, J. Seed, A. T. Simpson, F. Snowden, G. Stephenson, N. Turvey and A. Willfams.

The Chairman referred to the loss the Club had sustained by the death of Mr. T. B. Conway, and a resolution recording the deep regret of the members and their sympathy with his widow and relatives was passed in silence, the members standing.

Apologies for absence were read from Messrs. R. J. Austin, G. B. Burgess, F. J. Cheminais, H. L. Elston, and E. O. Morris. "That the Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting be taken as read, and that they be confirmed."

The Hon. General Secretary having read his report for the past year, W. Orrell moved, and N. Turvey seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Report of the Hon. General Secretary be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be accorded him for his services to the Club during the past year"

The President moved from the Chair-

" That Mr. H. Green be appointed a file Member of the Club." This was carried with acclamation.

The Hon, Racing Secretary having read his Report for the past year, F. Marriott moved, and J. S. Jonas seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Report of the Hon. Racing Secretary be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be accorded him for his services to the Club during the past year."

The Hon. Treasurer having read his Report for the past year, W. C. Humphreys moved, and C. J. Conway seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1933, be adopted, and that the best thanks of the meeting be given to R. Leigh Knipe and to the Auditors."

R. Leigh Knipe moved, and G. Stephenson seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Subscriptions for Full Members during 1934 shall be Twenty-five Shillings, with an Entrance Fee of Five Shillings, and that the Subscription for Honorary Members be a minimum of Ten Shillings. That the Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be : For those under 18 years of age, 5/- per annum; and for those between 18 and 21 years of age, 15/- per annum; together with the Entrance Fee of 5/- in all cases, and that a Prize Fund be continued."

A. Howarth and T. Royden were appointed Scrutineers.

W. P. Cook, proposed by D. R. Fell, and seconded by J. Kinder, was re-elected President.

W. H. Kettle, proposed by E. Edwards, and seconded by S. del Banco, was re-elected a Vice-President.

H. Green, proposed by W. Orrell, and seconded by R. Poole, was elected a Vice-President.

F. Marriott, proposed by S. del Banco, and seconded by J. S. Jonas, was elected Captain and Hon. Racing Secretary.

W. G. Connor, proposed by C. Randall, and seconded by J. R. Band, was elected a Sub-Captain.

E. Marries, Junr., was re-elected a Sub-Captain.

R. Leigh Knipe, proposed by A. T. Simpson, and seconded by T. Royden, was re-elected Hon. Treasurer.

H. W. Powell, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. General Secretary. It was RESOLVED by ballot that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee : F. Chandler, S. del Banco, E. Edwards, J. S. Jonas, A. Lucas, C. Randall, J. J. Salt, E. Snowden, G. Stephenson, and W. T. Venables.

E. O. Morris and C. F. Elias, proposed by the President, were elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1934.

F. Marriott proposed, and S. del Banco seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Club's Racing Programme for 1934 consist of the Invitation '100,' an Invitation 12 Hours Handicap, an Invitation '24,' and three or four 50 miles races."

C. J. Conway proposed, and W. C. Humphreys seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed."

S. del Banco proposed, and W. H. Scarff seconded, and it was RESOLVED-

"That the August Your be held-the destination being left to the Committee."

The president proposed and it was RESOLVED with acclamation-

"That a Special Vote of thanks be accorded to J. S. Jonas for the way in which he had edited the *Circular* during the past and previous years."

The President reported that R. A. Fulton's offer of Special Prizes, value Eight Guineas, was still open.

The meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers, Hon. General Secretary and Hon. Racing Secretary.

## RULES.

1 .- The Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."

2.—The Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

#### Officers.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

#### Committee.

4.—The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members including the Officers.

#### Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine, and report upon, the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

#### Meetings.

6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.

7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such

meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.

9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.

10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.

11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted URGENT by two-thirds of the Members present.

12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made in *propria persona* by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.

13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon, Secretary,

14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention todo so.

15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirdsmajority of the Members present and voting.

16 .- No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.

17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.

18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

#### Full Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accompanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly *Circular* issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude ; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

#### Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member of 15 years' standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Full Membership.

#### Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to, be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the longdistance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

### Subscriptions, etc.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shillings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be—for those under 18 years of age 5/-; and for those between 18 and 21 years of age 15/-, together with the Entrance Fee of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

#### Resignations, etc.

26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.

27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

### Finance.

28.—The funds of the Chub shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club : the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

29.— The Financial Vear of the Club shall expire on the 31st December in each year.

#### Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours; Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

#### Committee.

31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.

32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting,

33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the wellbeing of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every ease, be final.

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No. 6.—All tandem prizes will be divided, half to each man, and both riders must be *first-claim* Members of the Anfield B.C. and comply with Prize Rule No. 1.

No. 7.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same performance. No 50 or 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No Standard Medals can be claimed for any distance in Place to Place Record rides. Gold Medal, from Club Die, will only be awarded for Records, Fastest Times, First Prizes, and for Standard F, and upwards, as per Rule No. 2.

No. 8.—Members winning Medals may substitute Prizes of equal value, subject to the approval of the Committee as to the form these may take.

No. 9.—Claims for Medals, accompanied by proofs, must be sent in to the Hon. Racing Secretary within 7 days after the performance of each ride.

No. 10.—NO PIECE OF ROAD MAY, UPON ANY PRETEXT, BE COVERED MORE THAN TWICE, OF if covered, shall not be counted in the total distance claimed.

No. 11.—Motor pacing is entirely barred. In attempts for unpaced Standard Medals, followers are not allowed to approach the rider within 100 yards.

No. 12. All Prizes and Medals will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who shall have full power to decide any question which may arise as to the interpretation or application of the rules.

#### Races.

It is intended to hold three or four 50 Mile Handicaps (taudems to be admitted at the discretion of the Committee), the Invitation 100 Miles Handicap, an Invitation 24 Hours Ride and an Invitation 12 Hours Handicap during 1934.

### Special Prizes.

A Special Prize, value Five Guineas, offered by R. A. Fulton, to the Member winning the North Road "24."

A Special Prize, value Three Guineas, offered by R. A. Fulton, to the Member winning the "Tricycle Trophy."

A Special Prize, value Fifteen Guineas, offered by an anonymous donor, to the Member beating the R.R.A. 24-Hours Record (428 miles).

Prizes will be presented to the Members attending the greatest and second greatest number of fixtures (Officers and Committee barred).

Claims for Club Runs made by Members other than those attending Club Teas must be passed by the Committee.
