#### HON. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members, 8th January, 1938.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have again much pleasure in presenting my Report of the Club's Social and Touring activities for the year 1937.

The Membership now numbers 176, a decrease of 2 since last year. This figure is composed of 127 Full, 2 Junior Full and 47 Honorary Members.

Four new Members have been elected during the year. Three resignations have been accepted. Four Members have been transferred to the Honorary List and two names have been struck off.

It is with the deepest regret I have again to record the death of a Member during the year, viz., Mr. John Kinder, who passed away in October last. He joined the Club in 1914. From 1919 to 1925 he served on the Committee, and his opinions on questions regarding Racing were very valuable. He was always cheerful and ever ready to help in any way he could. He will be especially missed at the Invitation 100.

There have been 52 Fixtures during the year with an average attendance of 26.307, a decrease of 3.962 compared with 1936. Quarterly average attendances were—January to March, 26.307; April to June 29.461; July to September, 26.846, and October to December, 22.615.

The highest attendance was, as usual, at the Invitation "100," when 58 Members were out. The lowest attendance was at Little Budworth on 17th July, when only 11 Members were out.

Mr. S. T. Carver has attended 43 runs and gains the First Attendance Prize.

Mr. T. Royden has attended 42 runs and gains the Second Attendance Prize.

AUTUMNAL TINTS TOUR. Llanarmon D.C. Headquarters, West Arms. Attracted 26 Members.

#### HON, RACING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you my Report of the Club's racing activities for 1937. The programme as adopted at the last Annual General Meeting has been carried out successfully. The fields, though small, were evenly matched, and some excellent competition was seen.

The first "50," run on April 24th, attracted only ten riders, but an excellent race resulted. Rock was fastest with 2.17.37; first handicap was won by Carver with a very creditable first ride round our course of 2.19.45 and 8 minutes allowance. Second and third handicaps were won by Hughes, 2.23.10 (11 mins.), and Rigby Band, 2.22.17 (10 minutes).

In the second "50" on May 29th, Salt (scratch), apparently recovered from his invalid state, once more was fastest with 2.17.47, only eight seconds ahead of Reeves, another newcomer to our course, who gained first handicap with 2.17.55 less 4 minutes. H. Thomas was second with 2.21.58 (7 minutes); and Haynes was third in 2.22,18 (7 minutes). Twelve started and eleven finished in this event.

We departed from tradition in the Invitation "100," which was held this year on Sunday, June 6th. The field was not so representative this year, probably owing to the travelling difficulties. Road conditions were much improved and amply justified the change made. The race itself was a personal triumph for Reeves, a new member of "Ours," as he won first handicap and third fastest prizes besides leading our team to victory with a splendid time of 4.40.36. Pickersgill, of the Veg. C. & A.C., smashed course record with the fastest time of 4.32.13, and Scarratt, of the Potteries was second fastest with 4.44.30.

Pickersgill's wonderful time also gained him second handicap from scratch, whilst third handicap went to A. N. Pierce, of Birkenhead N.E., with a ride of 4.53.3 (20 minutes). J. E. Carr, 4.47.23, and Salt, 4.49.43, completed our team which was more than 12 minutes better than the second team, Birkenhead N.E. Our own finishers were Carver, inside evens with 4.58.7 (20); Hughes, 5.10.40 (30), H. Thomas, 5.5.1 (24); Connor 5.1.55 (20), and I. Thomas, 5.20.0 (30).

The third "50" on July 24th, had an entry of 11, of which but 9 started and 7 finished. Salt was again fastest with 2.15.32; Haynes maintained his steady improvement and with a splendid ride of 2.16.53 easily won first handicap with his allowance of 6 minutes. 1. Thomas showed a welcome inprovement and was second with 2.28.27 (14 minutes). Carver, with a consistent ride of 2.19.37 (5 minutes) was third.

The Invitation "12" on August 14th attracted a record entry of 53 and also some of the worst weather of the summer. In spite of a wretched morning, 49 started on their long trek. The morning was cold, wet and windy, and the afternoon, though dry, was rendered very uncomfortable by a very strong northerly wind. Carr, of Ours, seems to like tough conditions, and covered greatest distance of 1281 miles, which with two miles allowance also gave him first prize in the Club handicap.

Lightfoot, of Birkenhead Victoria, was second with 226 miles, and A. Smith, Yorkshire Veg., third with 225\frac{5}{8} miles. In the Club handicap Carver (10 miles) was second with 216\frac{1}{2} miles; and Salt (scratch) third with 224\frac{3}{8} miles. This year a team race was instituted amd we won this with 669\frac{1}{8} miles, per Carr, Salt and Carver, from the Golden Arrow C.C., with 653\frac{1}{8} miles. Our other finishers were Reeves with 211\frac{1}{4} miles, Haynes, who beat his previous best with 210\frac{1}{8} miles, and Barker with 177 miles for his first ride at this distance.

For the fourth "50," on September 11th, there were 9 starters and finishers out of an entry of 11. Salt was again fastest with 2.16.59. Handicaps were as follows: Reeves (3) 2.18.31; Rock (3) 2.19.21; and Rigby Band (7) 2.23.39.

In Open events our name has been well maintained, and I will mention the important successes. In the Grosvenor "100," Reeves was 5th fastest with 4.48.50, and with Rock and Carver constituted second team. Reeves improved his time in the Gomersal "100" to 4.44.21, being 9th fastest. On the following week Reeves did 2.14.31, and Carver 2.17.54 in the Sharrow "50."

In the Warrington "100," Carver was 7th fastest with 4.51.35, Reeves 9th with 4.55.11 and Salt 10th with 4.55.44, these three gaining 2nd team medals. The Bath Road "100" found Salt getting back to his "100" form and he was 11th with 4.39.2; Reeves further improved to 4.41.43; Carr, 4.47.46; and Rock 4.48.52. In the Speedwell "100" Carver did 4.53.16 and Haynes 4.56.49.

Salt beat his previous best in the Manchester Wheelers "12," covering 235½ miles for 6th place, and with Rock's 223¾ and Carver's 222¾ enabled us to win second team prize. We also won 2nd team medals in the Monckton "50," per Salt, 2.18.36, Rock, 2.20.7 and Carver 2.20.17, whilst Carver also gained 2nd handicap award.

There is also some news to report in the record world. On May 23rd Rock and Salt made an unsuccessful attempt on the Edinburgh to Liverpool tandem record, adverse weather conditions compelling them to retire just beyond Moffatt. On October 10th Salt scheduled for the Northern "50" and "100" miles records, and was successful in lowering them with the splendid times of 1.58.24 and 4.22.22 respectively.

In conclusion, I would thank those upon whose support we depend. To the timekeepers, checkers, and marshals; to those motoring members who so willingly lend their cars for transporting our racing men; and to those members who turn out week-end after week-end to attend to the bodily comfort of our riders; my sincerest thanks.

- A. Williams, proposed by W. P. Rock, and seconded by E. Haynes, Junr., was elected a Sub-Captain.
- E. Haynes, Junr., proposed by S. T. Carver, and seconded by J. D. Cranshaw, was re-elected a Sub-Captain.
- R. Leigh Knipe, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. Treasurer.
- H. W. Powell, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. General Secretary.
- It was RESOLVED by Ballot that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee:—S. T. Carver, F. Chandler, W. J. Jones, A. Lucas, F. Marriott, J. E. Reeves, W. P. Rock, J. J. Salt and E. Snowden.
- E. O. Morris and C. F. Elias, proposed by the President, were elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1938.
- W. G. Connor proposed, and F. E. Marriott seconded, and it was Resolved—
- "That the Club's Racing Programme for 1938 consist of the Invitation '100,' and an Invitation Scratch 12 Hours Time Trial combined with a Club Handicap, and three or four 50 miles Races."

H. Roskell proposed, and F. Chandler seconded, and it was Resolved—

"That the Club Tour at Easter be to Bettws-y-Coed."

A. T. Simpson proposed, and W. G. Connor seconded, and it was Resolved—

"That a Club Tour at Whitsuntide be to Shrewsbury."

"That the August Tour be held—the destination being left to the Committee."

The President proposed and it was Resolved with acclamation—

"That a Special Vote of Thanks be accorded to Mr. F. Chandler, for the brilliant way in which he had edited the Circular during the past year."

The Meeting closed with hearty votes of thanks to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers, Hon. General Secretary and Hon. Racing Secretary.



#### RULES.

- r .- The Club shall be called the " ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."
- The Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

#### Officers.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

#### Committee.

The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members including the Officers.

#### Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine and report upon the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

#### Meetings.

- 6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.
- 7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

- 8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.
- 9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.
- 10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.
- II.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted urgent by two-thirds of the Members present.
- 12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made in *propria persona* by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.
- 13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.
- 14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.
- 15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

- 16.-No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.
- 17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.
- 18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

#### Full Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accompanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly Circular issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

#### Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member,

of 15 years' standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Full Membership.

#### Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the long-distance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

#### Subscriptions, etc.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shillings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be—for those under 18 years of age, 5/-; for those between 18 and 21 years of age, 15/-, and for those between 21 and 25 years of age, £1/1/0, together with the Entrance Fee

of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

#### Resignations, etc.

- 26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.
  - 27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

#### Finance.

- 28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club; the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.
- 29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December, in each year.

#### Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours;

Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

#### Committee.

- 31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.
- 32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.
- 33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

No. 6.—All tandem prizes will be divided, half to each man, and both riders must be *first-claim* Members of the Anfield B.C. and comply with Prize Rule No. 1.

No. 7.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same performance. No 50 or 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No Standard Medals can be claimed for any distance in Place to Place Record rides. Gold Medal from Club Die, will only be awarded for Records, Fastest Times, First Prizes, and for Standard E and upwards, as per Rule No. 2.

No. 8.—Members winning Medals may substitute Prizes of equal value, subject to the approval of the Committee as to the form these may take.

No. 9.—Claims for Medals, accompanied by proofs, must be sent in to the Hon. Racing Secretary within 7 days after the performance of each ride.

No. 10.—No piece of Road May, upon any pretext, be covered more than twice, or if covered, shall not be counted in the total distance claimed.

No. 11.—Motor pacing is entirely barred. In attempts for unpaced Standard Medals, followers are not allowed to approach the rider within 100 yards.

No. 12.—All Prizes and Medals will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who shall have full power to decide any question which may arise as to the interpretation or application of the rules.

#### Races.

It is intended to hold three or four 50 Mile Handicaps (tandems to be admitted at the discretion of the Committee), the Invitation 100 Miles Handicap, and an Invitation Scratch 12 Hours Time Trial combined with a Club Handicap, during 1938.
