HON. GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members,
7th January, 1939.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have again much pleasure in presenting my Report of the Club's Social and Touring activities for the year 1938.

The Membership now numbers 173, a decrease of 3 since last year. This figure is composed of 125 Full, 3 Junior Full and 45 Honorary Members.

Five New Members have been elected during the year, 3 Full and 2 Junior Full.

Three resignations have been accepted. Two Members have been transferred to the Honorary List and One Member has been transferred from Honorary to Full Membership.

It is with the deepest regret I have to record the death of Four Members during the year, viz. : Messrs. E. A. Thompson, T. Royden, R. L. Knipe and C. J. Conway.

Mr. E. A. Thompson joined the Club in 1885, elected on Committee in 1888 and in 1889 acted as Hon. Secretary. He left the Club in 1895, but rejoined in 1929 after the death of his brother. He took a keen interest in all matters relating to the Club.

Mr. T. Royden joined the Club in 1910, served on the Committee, 1912, 1913 and 1915, and was elected a Life Member in 1936. He was possessed with the real Anfield spirit, always cheerful and ready to help in any way ; one of the most regular attenders, winning the Attendance prize on 10 occasions.

Mr. R. L. Knipe joined the Club in 1898. His performances in the last years of last century and early years of this were outstanding, gaining many records for the Club. His finest ride was the "24" of 1902, when he finished with 406½ miles. He was elected a Life Member in 1936. He rendered yeoman service to the Club, acting as Hon. Treasurer for nearly 25 years. He was one of the finest Anfielders of all time.

Mr. C. J. Conway passed away in December after a long illness. He joined the Club in 1891. From 1898 to 1903 he acted as Hon. Treasurer. He was one of the most respected of Club Members and had endeared himself in the hearts of everyone. He had the unique distinction of taking the Club photograph for over 40 years. Another real Anfielder—he thought the world of the Club.

There have been 54 Fixtures during the year with an average attendance of 23,351, a decrease of 2,742 compared with 1937. Quarterly average attendances were—January to March 23,230, April to June, 28,538, July to September, 24,692 and October to December, 17.8.

The highest attendance was as usual at the Invitation "100," when 55 Members were out. The lowest attendance was at Acton Bridge on 31st December, when only 9 Members were out.

Mr. D. C. Rowatt has attended 33 runs and gains the First Attendance Prize.

Mr. E. R. Green has attended 30 runs and gains the Second Attendance Prize.

AUGUST TOUR. To either the Bath Road "100," Speedwell "100" or Tricycle Trophy, Members making up their own parties. Altogether there were 36 Members out.

AUTUMNAL TINTS TOUR. Llanarmon, D.C. Headquarters, West Arms. Attracted 17 Members.

The best thanks of the Club are due to Mr. F. Marriott for the brilliant way in which he has conducted the Editorship of the *Circular*.

In conclusion, I tender my personal thanks to the President, Members of the Committee, and all those who in any way have assisted me with their help and advice during the year.

Mr. A. Lucas again deputised for me when on holiday and Mr. G. B. Burgess has kindly addressed the envelopes for the *Circular*. I tender my best thanks to both.

HON. RACING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have much pleasure in presenting to you my report of the Club's Time Trials activities for the past season. Four Fifties, the Open Invitation "100" and 12-hour events were all carried out successfully.

The first "50" was held on May 7th, with a disappointing entry of only 10, of whom 8 started. Salt (scratch) as usual provided the fastest time of 2.15.34. Sherman, a new member, gained 1st handicap award with an excellent first ride round our course of 2.29.48 (18). Thomas was second with 2.29.22 (13) and Haynes third with a good ride of 2.23.23 (3).

There was also an entry of 10 for the second "50" on May 28th. Times were much better than in the first event. Thomas greatly improved to 2.26.30 to win 1st handicap off 13 mins., Sherman seconds faster than before was second with 2.29.19 (14), whilst Rigby Band, beating his previous best over the course, was third with the splendid time of 2.21.55 (6). Salt was again fastest, well away from the rest with 2.14.25.

This year we again reverted to Whit Monday for our Invitation "100." Finding that last year's experiment made the event lose a lot of its social appeal, we decided this year to solve the traffic difficulties of the old course by scrapping it in its entirety, only keeping to Shrewsbury as headquarters. Valuable work was done by all members of the Course Committee, and in particular Messrs. H. Roskell and Marriott, in finding a new course, which I think, was as successful as it was unique. The event itself was a triumph for Yorkshire riders, and for the first time for many years, no Anfield name finds its place in the prize list. Fastest time was made by Firth, of the Bronte

Wheeler, with an amazing time of 4.33.56, which also gave him 1st handicap off scratch. 2nd fastest was Hey, also of the Bronte Wheelers, with 4.40.33, whilst Miller, of the Selby C.C. was third with 4.45.12. The other handicap awards were won by J. Tiffany, of the Pudsey Roads, with 4.50.25 less 16 mins., and B. Rangeley, Nun-Brook Wheelers, with 4.51.48 less 17 mins. The Bronte Wheelers were easy winners of the team medals with an aggregate time of 14.18.43 against 14.45.59 of the Bath Road Club. Our Riders' times were, Salt, 13th. 4.52.8, Carr, 5.2.23 with a puncture, Rock, 5.7.50 and Reeves, 5.27.53.

Some hard words have been said about the new course, and we ourselves have some small improvements in view, but this can be said; the event was run throughout without a hitch, on uncrowded practically traffic-free roads and with a wide straight finish well away from the main roads, and if one man can do 4.33 on it, there cannot be much wrong with it.

The 3rd "50" on July 23rd attracted 12 entries, a notable absentee being Salt, who has now been transferred down South. Carr gained a well-earned win in Club "50's" by being fastest with 2.20.8. First handicap was won by Farr, a new Manchester member, with a very creditable ride of 2.29.12 (13). Sherman was again in the winners, gaining 2nd handicap with another 2.29 ride off 13 mins., whilst Byron won 3rd prize with 2.23.41 (6).

Traffic difficulties in the Wirral and the difficulty of getting helpers down in Shropshire on Saturday morning caused us to alter both the course and day of running our Invitation "12" It was held this year on Sunday, August 14th, and the course was altered by doing the Wirral first and finishing in the lanes between the Whitechurch and Tarporley Roads. In order to give everyone equal finishing facilities we limited the entry to fifty and a full field was received.

The event was won by that well-known Cheshire Roder—Freddie Turner—with a splendid ride of 231 $\frac{3}{4}$ miles, who ran out time a mere fifty yards ahead of H. W. Smith, of the South Lancs. Road Club, one of the closest finishes to a "12" hour

that has ever been known. Third was Booth, of the Golden Arrow, with a distance of $229\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The team awards eluded us as they did in the "100." First was gained by the Walton C. & A.C., with a total of $649\frac{3}{8}$ miles against $637\frac{7}{8}$ miles of the Chester Road Club.

The Club handicap was won by Thomas, with a splendid ride of $207\frac{5}{8}$ plus 18 miles, 2nd was Barker, 183 miles plus 30 and 3rd, Haynes with $210\frac{3}{8}$ miles (scratch).

The 4th "50," held on August 27th, was disappointing in all but times—11 entries and only 9 starters. Fastest time was done by Haynes with a fine ride of 2.18.8. Sherman greatly improved his time to 2.23.3 to win 1st handicap off 7 mins., closely followed by Farr with 2.24.6 (7). Third prize was won by E. R. Green, who gained a well-merited success with a time of 2.38.10 less 17.

Our successes in open events this year have unfortunately been few, but this is, I am sure, but a passing phase, and next year will, I hope, see us once more to the fore.

In the "Andy Wilson" "50" Salt did 2.15.49 and Carr 2.18.6 against the winning time of 2.8.46 by Firth. In the Manchester Wheelers "12" Salt finished 4th after two punctures with $228\frac{3}{4}$ miles. In the West Cheshire "50" Salt was fastest with 2.15.35, and together with Byron's 2.23.35 and Rigby Band's 2.23.55, gained third team award.

Salt again did his usual fine ride on the Bath Road course, finishing in 4.35.46.

Whilst down South Salt put in some extensive riding as follows:—Ealing "50," 2.12.43 against Logan's winning time of 2.7.8, Bell Vue "50," 2.13.41 against Logan's 2.5.39, followed by another 2.12 ride in the Veg. C. & A.C. "50." Salt then did 229 miles in the Anerley "12" against Horwood's, of the Bath Road, mileage of 233. A fortnight later he was third in the Leamington "100" with 4.39.

This year it seems that Salt has been the only rider to attain any modicum of success in open events, although I might include my own ride of 393 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles in the Mersey Roads "24" for 5th place. I am sorry to say that there have been no Record attempts during the past season.

In conclusion, might I express my wholehearted thanks to the unselfish assistance rendered by all members of the Club whether timing, checking or transporting, and also to the local Clubs who gave us such invaluable assistance in our open even.

“ That the Report of the Hon. Racing Secretary be adopted, and that the best thanks of the Meeting be accorded him for his services to the Club during the past year.”

The Hon. Treasurer having read his Report for the past year, R. J. Austin moved, and E. Byron seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That the Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1938, be adopted, and that the best thanks of the Meeting be given to A. Lucas and to the Auditors.”

A. Lucas moved, and F. Marriott seconded—

“ That the Subscriptions for Full Members during 1939 shall be Twenty-five Shillings, with an Entrance Fee of Five Shillings, and that the Subscription for Honorary Members be a minimum of Ten Shillings. W. P. Rock, proposed by R. J. Austin, and seconded by E. Byron, was elected a Sub-Captain.

E. Haynes, Junr., proposed by G. B. Burgess, and seconded by J. D. Cranshaw, was re-elected a Sub-Captain.

J. Rigby Band, proposed by A. Lucas and seconded by F. Marriott, was elected Hon. Treasurer.

H. W. Powell, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. General Secretary.

G. B. Burgess moved, and R. J. Austin seconded, and it was RESOLVED—That the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Committee :—D. L. Birchall, F. Chandler, S. del Banco, J. S. Jonas, W. H. Kettle, A. Lucas, F. Marriott, A. E. Preston, T. Sherman.

E. O. Morris and C. F. Elias, proposed by R. J. Austin, and seconded by T. Sherman, were elected to audit the Accounts of the Club for the year ending 31st December, 1939.

W. G. Connor proposed, and F. E. Marriott seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That the Club's Racing Programme for 1939 consist of the Invitation ' 100,' and an Invitation Scratch 12 Hours Time Trial combined with a Club Handicap, and three or four 50 miles Races.”

W. G. Connor proposed, and I. A. Thomas seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That the Club Tour at Easter be to Kerry (Herbert Arms).”

R. J. Austin proposed, and J. Rigby Band seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That a Club Tour at Whitsuntide be to Shrewsbury.”

“ That the August Tour be held—the destination being left to the Committee.”

The President proposed and it was RESOLVED with acclamation—

“ That a Special Vote of Thanks be accorded to Mr. F. Marriott, for the brilliant way in which he had edited the *Circular* during the past year.”

Mr. E. Buckley proposed, and it was RESOLVED with acclamation—

“ That a special vote of thanks be accorded to the Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, Auditors, Scrutineers, Hon. General Secretary and Hon. Racing Secretary. ”

Arising out of any other Business :

W. H. Scarff proposed, and J. S. Jonas seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That the Diamond Jubilee Dinner for past and present Members be held on Saturday, 11th March, 1939, at the Stork Hotel, Liverpool.”

J. S. Jonas proposed, and D. L. Birchall seconded, and it was RESOLVED—

“ That a Dinner for Members and Friends be held at Shrewsbury at Whitsuntide.”

This concluded the Business.



RULES.

1.—The Club shall be called the "ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB."

2.—The Club shall consist of Cyclists who are considered eligible for membership under Rule 19.

Officers.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

Committee.

4.—The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members including the Officers.

Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine and report upon the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

Meetings.

6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.

7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.

9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.

10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.

11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted URGENT by two-thirds of the Members present.

12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made in *propria persona* by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.

13.—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.

14.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.

15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

16.—No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.

17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.

18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum.

Full Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accompanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly *Circular* issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member.

of 15 years' standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances ; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of Full Membership.

Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to be elected by the Committee at their next meeting ; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the long-distance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club ; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

Subscriptions, etc.

25.—The MINIMUM Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shillings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be—for those under 18 years of age, 5/- ; for those between 18 and 21 years of age, 15/-, and for those between 21 and 25 years of age, £1/1/0, together with the Entrance Fee

of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

Resignations, etc.

26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.

27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

Finance.

28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club; the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December, in each year.

Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours;

Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

Committee.

31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.

32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.

33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.

No. 6.—All tandem prizes will be divided, half to each man, and both riders must be *first-claim* Members of the Anfield B.C. and comply with Prize Rule No. 1.

No. 7.—If a Record Medal is awarded, no Standard Medal can be claimed for the same performance. No 50 or 100 miles Standard Medals will be given in any 12 or 24 Hours Race or Ride. No Standard Medals can be claimed for any distance in Place to Place Record rides. Gold Medal from Club Die, will only be awarded for Records, Fastest Times, First Prizes, and for Standard E and upwards, as per Rule No. 2.

No. 8.—Members winning Medals may substitute Prizes of equal value, subject to the approval of the Committee as to the form these may take.

No. 9.—Claims for Medals, accompanied by proofs, must be sent in to the Hon. Racing Secretary within 7 days after the performance of each ride.

No. 10.—NO PIECE OF ROAD MAY, UPON ANY PRETEXT, BE COVERED MORE THAN TWICE, or if covered, shall not be counted in the total distance claimed.

No. 11.—Motor pacing is entirely barred. In attempts for unpaced Standard Medals, followers are not allowed to approach the rider within 100 yards.

No. 12.—All Prizes and Medals will be awarded at the discretion of the Committee, who shall have full power to decide any question which may arise as to the interpretation or application of the rules.

Races.

It is intended to hold three or four 50 Mile Handicaps (tandems to be admitted at the discretion of the Committee), the Invitation 100 Miles Handicap, and an Invitation Scratch 12 Hours Time Trial combined with a Club Handicap, during 1939.

Prizes will be presented to the Members attending the greatest and second greatest number of fixtures (Officers and Committee barred).

Claims for Club Runs made by Members other than those attending Club Teas must be passed by the Committee.
