Hon. General Secretary's Report.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Members, 13th January, 1940.

MR. CHAIRMAN, AND GENTLEMEN,

I have usually commenced the Annual Report with the club's Social and Touring activities and given you figures regarding Club runs and information regarding the state of Membership. This year, however, I think first of all, I should place on record the fact that up to the present time we have thirteen active Members serving with His Majesty's Forces. Some of them are already on active service and others are expecting to go overseas in the near future.

They are, in alphabetical order: J. R. Band, Royal Engineers; B. H. Band, Royal Navy; E. Byron, Royal Artillery (Anti-Aircraft); R. Barker, Army Service Corps; W. A. Connor, Royal Navy; J. R. Fer, Army Service Corps; J. S. Jonas, Army Service Corps; W. P. Rock, Royal Engineers; J. E. Reeves, Royal Engineers; D. L. Ryalls, Royal Air Force; T. T. Samuel, Cheshire Yeomanry; T. Sherman, King's Liverpool; and D. Turner, Royal Air Force. I am confident the Club will join me in wishing these Members a safe return on conclusion of hostilities.

The Membership now numbers 172, a decrease of 1 since last year. This figure is composed of 123 Full Members, 4 Junior Full and 45 Honorary Members.

Nine new Members have been elected during the year, viz: 7 Full, 1 Junior Full and 1 Honorary.

Three Resignations have been accepted and 3 Members have been transferred to the Honorary List.

It is with the deepest regret I have to record the death of 6 Members during the year, viz: Messrs, G. H. Lake, J. S. Roberts, D. J. Bell, H. M. Buck, J. H. Sunter and W. H. Scarff.

- Mr. G. H. Lake joined the Club in 1918. Although his cycling days were over he took a great interest in the Club and was always willing to help in the Club Races by using his car for transport.
- Mr. J. S. Roberts joined the Club in 1925. It was thought his racing days were over, yet in 1927, in his 54th year he rode and finished in our "24," doing a fine ride of 330½ miles. Latterly on account of ill-health we did not see much of him. He was always a willing helper and most enthusiastic.
- Mr. D. J. Bell was the last of our Founder Members, and for the first 20 years took a very active interest in the Club. He served the Club first as Sub-Captain, then as Captain, Vice-President and finally the office of President.
 - Mr. W. H. Scarff passed away under very tragic circumstances. He joined in 1930. Although business interfered with his riding he came out whenever possible. He was a keen Anticler and a fine rider.
- Mr. H. M. Buck joined the Club in 1899. In 1902 he joined the Committee. In 1903 he became a Vice-Captain and in 1905 acted as Secretary. In 1901 Buck having Pritchard as a partner created an unpaced 12 hour tandem record of 200 miles. Right up to the end he took a keen interest in everything relating to the Club.
- Mr. J. H. Sunter joined in 1901. Although he was not a regular attender at runs he was very interested in everything relating to the Club.

Owing to the absence of so many Members it is inevitable that the average attendance should be adversely affected. Still, I think the year just closed may be considered as satisfactory. There have been 53 Fixtures during the year. The average attendance was 21.545, a decrease of 1.806 compared with 1938.

Quarterly average attendances were, January to March, 27.666; April to June, 28.076; July to September, 17.428; October to December, 14.357.

Mr. D. C. Rowatt has attended 35 runs and gains the first Attendance Prize.

Mr. W. T. Venables has attended 31 runs and gains the Second Attendance Prize.

During the year Mr. W. H. Kettle completed his 1000 runs. His total to the end of the year is 1,030. On behalf of the Club I tender him our heartiest congratulations.

The two Dinners held in connection with the Club's Diamond Jubilee were very well supported, and were a great success. The highest attendance was at the Dinner held on the 11th March, when 79 Members were present. The lowest was at Acton Bridge on 2nd September, when only two were present.

Hon. Racing Secretary's Report.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

It is my pleasure to present to you the Report of the Club's Time Trial activities for the past season on behalf of the Hon-Racing Secretary, who is at present serving in H.M. Forces. Three "50's," the Open Invitation "100" and 12 hour events were all carried out successfully.

The first "50" was held on 22nd April. Eleven names were on the starting sheet and only eight started. E. Haynes (scratch) was fastest with 2.24.25, a good ride under poor conditions. T. Sherman won the 1st handicap award with 2.29.57(5). E. R. Green was second, 2.42.31(17) and J. R. Band, 2.30.49(5) third.

For the second "50" there was an entry of 13, but only 9 started. E. Haynes (scratch) was again fastest with a fine ride of 2.17.29, beating J. E. Carr by a mere 6 seconds. L. Killip, a new member riding his first race, did a splendid ride of 2.28.27 and with an allowance of 20 mins., easily gained the first handicap award. The second handicap went to J. E. Carr, 2.17.35 (2). Another new member, H. V. Rourke, riding a tricycle, did a fine ride of 2.31.44 (15), and gained the third award.

Whitsuntide this year was the occasion of the Club's Diamond Jubilee Dinner, and provided the week-end with a dual interest. The new course was used again with certain modifications, and although the conditions were far from ideal it did not prevent last year's winner repeating his remarkable performance. Reuben Firth, of the Bronte Wheelers, returned the fastest time of the day with a sterling ride of 4.35.34, a truly wonderful ride for the day. Fred Butterworth, of the Manchester Roads, was second fastest with a fine ride of 4.41.4, N. Hey,

Bronte Wheelers, being third fastest with 4.42.6. The handicap awards were won by F. D. Acreman (Wolverhampton R.C.C.), first 4.55.50, less 25 minutes, W. W. Youell (Warwickshire Roads) second, 4.59.28, less 25 mins., and C. G. Baxter (Lancashire Roads,) third, 5.1.10, less 26 mins.

The Bronte Wheelers were the first team winners (Firth, Hey and Rangeley) for the second year in succession with an aggregate time of 14.25.7 with the Bath Road Club second (L. M. Baker, Harwood and Lawrence) with an aggregate time of 14.46.43. Our riders did not shine, and again no Anfield name appeared in the prize list, J. J. Salt being the fastest of "ours" with 4.55.15, J. E. Carr, 4.50.59, and J. R. Band, 5.55.8.

The third "50" attracted 11 entries, 7 of whom started, and only 4 finished. Len Killip was again the winner of the 1st handicap prize with 2.29.26 (12), notwithstanding a delay of five minutes with a puncture and is to be congratulated for a very fine ride. G. Farr was second, 2.27.21 (5), and H. V. Rourke (tricycle) 3rd, 2.37.50 (14). The fastest time was returned by J. E. Carr, 2.18.58 (scratch).

The Invitation *12," held on August 20th, was run on a Sunday. The field was limited to fifty riders and a full entry was received. The course was much the same as that used last year, one circuit of the Shropshire Triangle instead of two and using in its place a piece of road from Nantwich to Middlewich. The event was won by that well-known rider Alex. Smith, of the Colne Valley C.C., with a fine ride of 238½ miles, the distance being a record for the event, a fact which helped to prove that the alterations in the course were justified. W. J. Austin, of the Wolverhampton Wheelers, was a good second, 1½ miles behind with 237½ miles, H. W. Smith, of the South Lancs Road Club was third with 231½ miles. The team race was won by the Mersey Roads Club (Oldham, Mumford and Coote) with an aggregate of 652½ miles. The second team award was withheld as the third member of the Liverpool

Century Road Club did not complete the course as laid down. Six riders other than the prize winners beat 220 miles, thereby qualifying for silver standard medals.

The Club handicap was won by L. Killip with a splendid novice performance of 203 miles. H. V. Rourke, on a tricycle, was second with a very fine ride of 198\frac{1}{2}\$ miles. K. W. Barker was third with 191\frac{1}{4}\$ miles.

The fourth "50" was to have been held on September 2nd, but was cancelled owing to lack of support, caused by the critical political situation prevailing at that time.

Open events this year had little support from our members. Only two members entered for the East Liverpool Wheelers "50," J. E. Carr doing 2.18.39 and J. R. Baud 2.27.32. The West Cheshire T.T.C.A. "50" attracted six of our riders, J. E. Carr 2.26.29, T. Samuel, a new member riding his first race, 2.28.32. Killip, 2.29.33, and W. L. Rich also riding in his first race, 2.30.24. In the Rhos-on-Sea "50" we had two riders, Rich and Killip, Rich being the faster with 2.23.36, Killip 2.36.26. In the Bath Road "100" Jack Salt did his usual good ride of 4.41.39.

This report would not be complete without special mention of the fact that Jack Salt, who is now a Country Member of the Bath Road Club, won their Club championship and he is to be congratulated on his latest success.

No records were attempted this year.

In conclusion I should like to tender my best thanks to all those helpers, who make this game of ours possible, whether timing, checking, feeding or transport, for their unselfish assistance in the carrying out of our racing programme. I should like also to thank those members of outside clubs who gave us such invaluable assistance in our open events.

- H. W. Powell, proposed by the President, was re-elected Hon. General Secretary.

Rules.

3.—The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Captain, two Sub-Captains, Honorary Secretary or Secretaries, and Treasurer, all being Full Members.

Committee.

4.—The Committee shall consist of eighteen Members, including the Officers.

Auditors.

5.—Two Auditors from amongst the Members, none of the Committee being eligible, shall be appointed annually at the Annual General Meeting, to examine and report upon the Accounts and Balance Sheet.

Meetings.

- 6.—The Annual General Meeting shall be held within the first two weeks of January, to receive the Hon. Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Balance Sheet; to appoint Officers and Committee for the ensuing twelve months; and to transact any other business that may be found necessary.
- 7.—A General Meeting of the Club shall take place whenever the Committee or Secretary convenes the same. Thirteen to form a quorum.

- 8.—It shall be the duty of the Committee or Secretary to convene a General Meeting when requested to do so, in writing, by ten or more Full Members of the Club, and they shall call such meeting within two weeks after receiving such requisition. If the Committee or Secretary fails to call such meeting, then the requisitionists shall be entitled to call it, but no such General Meeting shall be called by the requisitionists to discuss any matter voted upon at a General Meeting within the previous twelve months.
- 9.—Six days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given by the Hon. Secretary, who shall at the same time circulate amongst the Members an Agenda paper of the matters to be brought forward.
- 10.—Any member wishing to bring forward any matters shall send particulars to the Hon. Secretary, who shall cause the same to be entered on the Agenda of the next General Meeting.
- 11.—Business which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall not be brought forward until all the subjects on the Agenda have been disposed of, nor shall such business then be discussed unless it be voted urgent by two-thirds of the Members present.
- 12.—Any proposition appearing on the Agenda paper in the name of an absent member shall be deemed equal to, and treated as, a proposition made in *propria persona* by the said Member, and shall be moved by the Hon. Secretary.
- 13,—Every Amendment and every proposition which does not appear on the Agenda paper shall be written and signed by its proposer and seconder, on a form which shall be provided by the Hon. Secretary.
- J₁₄.—No Resolution of any previous General Meeting shall be rescinded unless the Member proposing to cancel such resolution shall have given notice on the Agenda paper of his intention to do so.
- 15.—No alteration of the Rules of the Club shall be made except at a General Meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority of the Members present and voting.

- 16.-No Proxy Voting shall be allowed.
- 17.—The Minutes of all Meetings shall be open for inspection to any Member of the Club on giving reasonable notice to the Hon. Secretary.
- 18.—Committee Meetings shall take place each month, preferably during the second week. Seven to form a quorum,

Full Membership.

19.—Candidates for Membership must fill up a form provided by the Club, which must also be signed by the proposer and seconder (both having been Full Members of the Club for at least two years), and forward the same to the Hon. Secretary, accompanied by the Entrance Fee as per Rule 25. Each candidate's name, together with the names of his proposer and seconder, must appear in the next Monthly Circular issued after the candidate's nomination has been received, after which the nomination shall come up for consideration at the next Committee Meeting. If any objections are received, the Committee shall consider them on their merits, two negative votes to exclude; but if the nomination be still insisted on by the proposers, a Special General Meeting shall be called to consider the candidature, ten black balls to exclude.

20.—Any Member violating the rules or regulations of the Club, or being discovered not to be, or ceasing to be an amateur, or acting in a manner derogatory to the interests of the Club, may be expelled by the votes of a two-thirds majority of the Members present, and voting, at a Special General Meeting summoned for the purpose, and such Member shall receive six days' notice of such Meeting. Any Member so expelled shall forfeit all claim upon the property of the Club, and shall cease to be a Member. Voting to be by ballot.

Life Membership.

21.—A General Meeting of the Members may, for eminent services rendered the Club, elect to Life Membership any Member.

of 15 years' standing, or having completed 1,000 run attendances; such Life Member shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of full Membership.

Honorary Membership.

22.—Candidates for Honorary Membership shall be proposed and seconded by Full Members, and shall, unless objected to be elected by the Committee at their next meeting; but should any objection be made, it shall be dealt with under Rule 19. A General Meeting of the Members may, for service rendered the Club, place upon the Honorary Membership List the name of any Member of three years' standing who shall be leaving the country. Such name to remain there during the term of his residence abroad, free from any Annual Subscription. Such a Member may on his return resume Full Membership upon his notifying the Secretary of his intention so to do, without undergoing the formality of re-election.

23.—Honorary Members shall not receive the regular notices of Club runs, etc., nor shall they be permitted to attend or vote at any General Meetings, nor to take part in more than three Club runs during the year, nor to compete for any of the longdistance prizes or in any of the closed events.

24.—An Honorary Member may become a Full Member upon payment of the difference between his honorary subscription and the current subscription and Entrance Fee of the Club; but his name must come before the Committee in the usual way.

Subscriptions, etc.

25.—The Minimum Annual Subscription for Honorary Members shall be 10/-, no entrance fee being charged to them. The Annual Subscription for Full Members shall be Twenty-five Shillings, payable within one month from date of election with an Entrance Fee of 5/-. The Annual Subscription for Junior Full Members shall be—for those under 18 years of age, 5/-; for those between 18 and 21 years of age, 15/-, and for those between 21 and 25 years of age, £1/1/0, together with the Entrance Fee

of 5/- in each case. Any Member whose Renewal Subscription is not paid by 1st March shall receive written application from the Treasurer, and if payment be not made within one month from the date of such notice, the Treasurer shall bring the matter before the Committee, that body having full power to deal with the case as it thinks fit. After the 31st August in each year, the subscription to incoming Members shall be one-half the ordinary Annual Subscription, but after the 31st October in each year the full Annual Subscription paid by such Members shall provide Membership to the 31st December in the following year, the full Entrance Fee shall be chargeable under all circumstances.

Resignations, etc.

26.—Any Officer or Member of the Committee wishing to resign his office or seat on the Committee, shall notify the same (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, for the information of the Committee, but until such resignation shall have been accepted, he shall continue to exercise the duties and retain the responsibilities of his office.

27.—Any Full Member wishing to resign must give notice (in writing) to the Hon. Secretary, before the Annual General Meeting; otherwise he will be held accountable for the ensuing year's subscription.

Finance.

28.—The funds of the Club shall be banked in the name of the Anfield Bicycle Club; the President and Treasurer for the time being shall jointly sign cheques to meet current expenditure, as authorised by the Committee. All accounts to be passed by the Committee and initialled by the Chairman before payment.

29.—The Financial Year of the Club shall expire on the 31st December, in each year.

Club Colours.

30.—The Club Colours shall be Blue and Black. The Badge shall be a Silver Button enamelled with the Club Colours;

Record Breakers' Badges shall be distinguished by a Beaded Edge. The Badges shall remain the property of the Club, and upon the expiration of Membership, if called for, shall be returned to the Hon. Secretary, who will allow for same. The Captain shall wear a Gold Monogram Cap Badge.

Committee.

- 31.—All runs shall be arranged by the Committee, and shall not be altered without its consent.
- 32.—The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy in the Officers or Committee which shall occur within the year, subject to confirmation by the next General Meeting.
- 33.—The Committee may decide any question on the meaning of these Rules, or anything relative to the Club not provided for therein, and may do whatever they deem necessary for the well-being of the Club, which is not inconsistent with these Rules. The decision of the Committee shall be final, unless notice of appeal (in writing) be given to the Hon. Secretary within seven days following that on which the decision is arrived at. All such appeals shall be heard at the next General Meeting, and the decision of such Meeting shall, in every case, be final.
