The report on the Invitation 12 Hours was submitted by the Chairman and he gave the results which have already appeared in the circular, he reported that Mr. G. Hall referred to the practice of a competitor in a race catching another and riding for a considerable distance near him and he suggested that clubs organising open races should issue a warning against this practice. This matter was discussed and the discussion was extended to include the necessity of competitors observing the ordinary rules of the road while racing.
